President Amy Larsen called the meeting to order at 10:30 a.m. and Pastor Mary led the group in prayer.

Approval of Minutes:

Minutes of Annual Congregational meeting of February 3, 2002 were approved as written. (MOTION 2:1:03)

Pastor Mary Janz's Report: see submitted report

Pastor Mary emphasized her gratitude to all who have made this past year so successful. Our extensive outreach efforts have required the participation and support of many. We were blessed with receiving over \$60,000 of grant money as well as receiving extraordinary donations by members of the congregation. We were challenged this past Fall when Velvetta Hargrove resigned earlier than expected. Pastor Mary emphasized this congregation's positive attitude toward change — willing to take risks and step out of our comfort zone. In particular, Pastor Mary thanked Amy Larsen for her great leadership and presented her with a card highlighting the gift of a framed spiritual message. While noting especially the outreach programs of EASY and our recent efforts for ESL classes at Emmaus, Pastor Mary asked for help with visiting shut-ins.

Pastor Sharon Georgi's Report: see submitted report

Pastor Sharon pointed out how quickly the past months have gone. She's enjoyed her time with us and looks forward to new and exciting activities this coming year.

President Amy Larsen's Report: see submitted report

Amy acknowledged several members of the congregation, council and "friends of the congregation" — Nancy Smith and her family. She especially thanked the pastors for all they do to make things happen at and through Emmaus.

Financial Report:

Approved as presented with no questions or discussion. (MOTION 2:2:03)

Budget 2003:

Approved unanimously. (MOTION 2:3:03). A suggestion was made to resurrect the 2001—A Faith Odyssey Fund activity. We have about \$60,000 left on the mortgage and with some focused effort, we might easily meet our goal of being debt free soon.

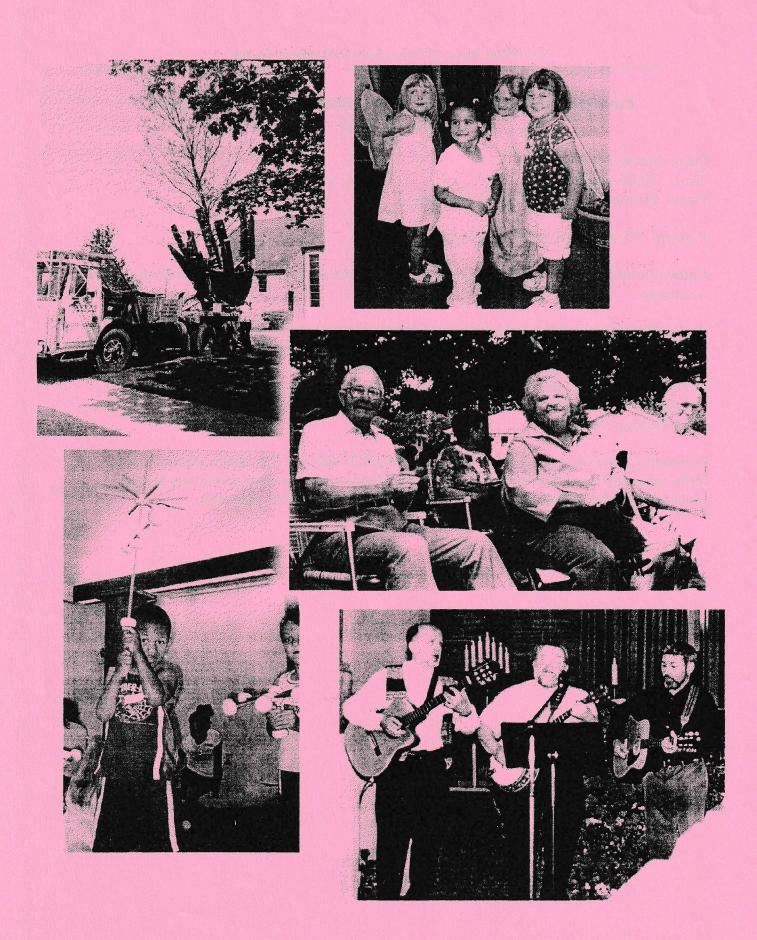

Present: 70 members of Emmaus Lutheran Church

Cathy Knuteson opened the meeting by explaining that we need to consider refinancing our mortgage.

Pastor Mary explained the restructuring of the present loan from one with an 8.25% interest rate, a balloon payment August 1, 2005 of \$40,000, and monthly payments of \$966 to a ten-year fixed mortgage with interest rate of approximately 6%. This would lower our monthly payment to \$651, or we could pay the current amount and finish paying the mortgage in 73 months. There would be a one-time charge of \$586 by Thrivent, but no other closing costs.

President Cathy Knuteson entertained a motion (MOTION 3:1:03), which was brought forth, seconded and then asked for questions. There were none, so a vote was taken, which passed the motion unanimously for restructuring the mortgage loan.



Pastor Mary's report

The year 2003 was a year of growth for our neighborhood outreach as well as a time of a number of changes in the support staff of Emmaus. For me personally, it was a time when I was called upon frequently to be apart of leadership for the Racine and synod ELCA congregations. The year was one of challenges in terms of volunteers and funding for outreach, and I am very proud of the generous response of folks from Emmaus both in terms of time and money.

Taking on new responsibilities as paid part-time staff members have been Valerie Crehan, Kerry Hunter, Jeff White and Suzanne Landis.

Valerie has done a great job of revamping EASY, our Tuesday and Thursday after school program for elementary children. Trained teen assistants and volunteer Ruth Copeland, together with other adult volunteers who come to read with the kids, give the children the one-on-one attention they both want and need. In the spring, Valerie added to her responsibilities the administrative role of Racine ELCA Neighborhood Camp Director, working with the staffs from the seven participating churches. Aided by Nancy Smith and leaders from the host churches. Valerie was instrumental in keeping everything running smoothly. Most recently, following the resignation of Marty Aiken due to a move to Japan, Valerie has also coordinated the scheduling of mentors going to Wadewitz School.

Kerry Hunter and Jeff White are

new to our custodial and groundskeeping staff this year. Replacing Harley Slater, who passed away unexpectedly last year, and providing relief for Matt Liesch's schedule, they divide responsibilities: Kerry does the inside cleaning and other special projects such as painting; and Jeff's duties are primarily in the areas of groundskeeping and maintenance. They are competent and willing, serving the church's needs very well.

Another change in staff has been our Adult Choir director. Suzanne Landis, interim director during Marsha Connet's leave of absence last spring, became the permanent director following Marsha's resignation. As an ordained Methodist minister, she also has shared her gift of preaching with the congregation.

In addition to paid staff, there have been some changes in volunteer staff. Carol Rudey has stepped down as Senior Center Director, and I have since arranged for the programs and lunches twice each month. (A big thanks to Pat Jensen, who cooks once each month!) Pat Liesch has turned the coordination of the REST homeless program over to Chris Lamberton (the overall programming and logistics) and to Kris Veenstra (food preparation), who share the program with volunteers from Atonement Lutheran and Second Presbyterian Churches. Nancy Smith directed our Neighborhood Camp and set up our new children's library of approximately 2,000 volumes. Don & Dolly Orth did all the cooking for Neighborhood Camp, and countless volunteers gave many hours. Gregg

Albright and Carol Yust dedicate time, concern and energy to our youth.

Joy Lamberton took over the job of entering weekly offerings into the computer, a job Margaret Christensen had so faithfully taken care of for several years. Thanks are also due to Marge and Lyle Zielke and Al and June Beck, who began overseeing Emmaus' participation in the Community Meals program this year.

Paul Berge continues to run the office, prepare bulletins and newsletters, keep our web site up to date and put up with my lost keys, misplaced papers, unpredictable schedule and tendency to try to squeeze too much into too little time. Thank you, Paul, for your steadiness, commitment and hard work.

I want to thank those who have stepped or will be stepping down from their positions: Pat Liesch, Carol Rudey, Marsha Connet, Marty Aiken, Bob and Margaret Christensen, and church council members. I especially want to thank Caren Lamberton for her dedication, commitment and long hours serving as the treasurer of the congregation. She also handled all of the payroll for Neighborhood Camp and EASY.

And, to the rest of the staff: Joyce Kaiser, Pastor Sharon, Denise Keller and Karla Bielewicz, I express my thanks. You touch people through your unique gifts, and I have also appreciated your constancy in the midst of so many staff changes this past year.

In the midst of change, significant ministry has been happening here at

Emmaus, and that has been possible because of God's leading and the prayers and hard work of so many of our members and friends. Because of all of you, our ministry is often lifted up as a model for outreach in our Synod. The November event "A Time to Be Born" held at Atonement Lutheran Church was evidence of that.

The challenges before us are great — we will need to secure further outside funding in the next months if we are to maintain our current staff and programming. In addition to applying for short-term grant money (primarily for outreach) this spring, I propose that we form a team to develop a longer-term ministry plan for Emmaus. I would like to then work with Assistants to the Bishop, Sue Ruehle and Greg Van Dunk, and submit that plan with a request for funding to the Division for Outreach of the ELCA.

The ministry of Emmaus needs the prayers of all of us, and we also need some forward-thinking leaders of vision to be a part of the Vision and Ministry Team. Let us continue to dream and collaborate and to ask for the Spirit's guidance as we move forward to proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ. How do the next steps in this incredible journey include you? I'm eager to see how our ministry unfolds.

Thank you for your partnership; it's a privilege to do ministry together.

Pastor Sharon's Report

I like to look back at the previous year's Annual Report before I write the new one for this year. What a difference a year can make! 2003 began with one of the three chaplains from Lincoln Lutheran, the other part of my call, retiring in January. This left only two of us to cover everything. Instead of being responsible for services one Sunday a month, I now was responsible for two and three Sundays, which meant that I could not be at Emmaus for worship as often as I had been the previous year. Also, in February, I began taking a CPE (Clinical Pastoral Education) class at Alexian Village in North Milwaukee. The completion of this second unit was a part of my "call" to Emmaus and Lincoln Lutheran. For the next four months, I spent eight classroom hours of recorded volunteer chaplain work, which had to be turned in at the end of the unit. This no sooner ended when my husband had hip replacement surgery and two months later was diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease.

To say that I felt somewhat overwhelmed at times would be putting it mildly, but as I began to get back to a more normal routine as fall approached, my husband and I reflected on what the first half of the year had been like. I could see all of the ways that God had been there, holding my hand ... encouraging when the next step was unsure or frightening. As a pastor, I am with people all of the time who are going through these things. This time, it was my turn, and I was warmed by the support I got from the Emmaus family. Notes, prayers,

conversations of encouragement, offers of help if it was needed, etc. Even though there was nothing that anyone else could do, just the words of encouragement and concern made such a difference! I saw the face of Christ reflected in each of your faces, and heard God's love in your words and patience. That is what living in "the Kingdom" is all about, and I believe that spirit is alive and growing among us!

Emmaus is fast gaining a reputation for outreach to those in need and looking for ways to make our presence known in the community. On November 7 and 8, Pastor Mary and I attended the Clergy Gathering, at which all of the ELCA churches in Racine brought their pastors and as many congregation m embers as would like to attend. It was a two-day event, directed at finding ways to make the ELCA known in Racine, by finding ways to address the needs of the community and churches. I was proud that the chairs around our table were filled with people from Emmaus. As the second day went on, it was obvious how much we are connected to the community. I was proud to sit among you.

In many ways, the year has progressed much as last year. I continued to be on call each Friday (and/or other days as needed), allowing Pastor Mary a day off, and covering during her vacation weeks. I enjoy being able to lead our worship together or being a part of the service in any way. My calendar shows that I was able to do this twelve times. I have continued with my call to visit the sick and homebound. I

have made over 130 hospital, nursing home, and home visits, brining communion and our blessings to them. Our Lay Ministers are bringing the service tapes, communion and fellowship to our homebound, also. I am grateful for their presence! This year, I was asked to do three funerals. It is always an honor to be with the families during those times.

I enjoyed being a part of the summer carnival at the end of Neighborhood Camp. As I tried to throw a baseball and dunk Pastor Mary, I realized how long it had been since I had thrown one, and as I sat on the dunk tank seat, I realized how good some of our young people *are* at throwing one! It was great fun, and I look forward to next summer.

I was not able to spend as much time with the Sunday School this year, but we did connect during "The Signs of Christmas." Because of my preaching requirements of Lincoln, I was not able to

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be present for several of the Sunday rehearsals, and I am grateful for everyone's help. You did a great job... everything from painting scenery, building a stair unit, making all of the signs, the music, and just physically putting all together. Thank you for your time, talent and presence! I am always amazed when the "moment of truth" comes and the program begins. I swear that I can hear God chuckling and saying, "All right! Next week, Broadway!"

I do not know what changes this new year will bring. There is a wonderful Jewish saying that one of my seminary professors used to use, "God will provide!" It fits every occasion. As we step out into the coming weeks, one thing we can be sure of is that we do not walk alone; God is there for us and with us and through Him, we are there for each other!

It feels so good to do God's work. Why? It simply feels good to ease the way for others; to lighten someone's load. It's

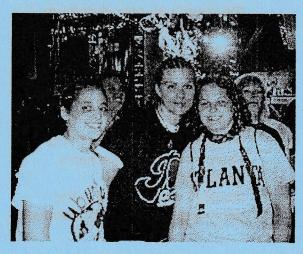

Building & Grounds Committee Report

This past year has been a busy year for Building and Ground Committee. The volunteer support was great! The following projects were completed:

- Unplugged the sewers running between the men's and women's bathrooms in the basement and the sanitary lift.
- Painted Fellowship Hall.
- Painted the east stairwell to the choir loft.
- Went over the entire sanitary lift system with United Mechanical and had Pat's Septic pump out the sump. This was necessary because the lift was inoperative.
- Repaired the men's first floor toilet.
- Replaced the lawn tractor
 transmission drive belt, installed
 the mower, and tuned it up.
- Put down 30,000 square feet of Scott's Turf Builder Plus 2 around the church.
- Replaced a defective steam valve and rusted-out heating pipe in the church basement.
- Installed new aluminum fascia on the church an new aluminum fascia and soffit on the service garage.
- Installed the window air conditioners in the church.
- Repaired the outside lights on the west side of the church.
- Installed two new sinks in the church basement women's bathroom.
- Installed a new faucet in the parsonage second floor bathroom.

- Started up the church boilers for the heating season.
- Removed the window air conditioners at the church.
- Put the storm windows on at the parsonage.
- Replaced lights in the elevator.
- Reset the timers for the outside lights.
- Replaced floodlights around the church.
- Replaced the steeple lights with new 6000-hour floodlights.
- Test ran the hot water heater for the REST program shower prior to the start of the program.
- Serviced the lawn tractor and snow blower, including grease, oil and filter change.
- Replaced the following lights in the sanctuary:
 - four banks of lights in peak.
 - west pulpit and lectern spotlights.
 - night light in the peak.
- Repaired the floor buffer, which included replacing fifty feet of electrical cord and rewiring the electrical switch.
- Replaced outside floodlights under the cross.
- Cleaned out the gutters on the parsonage and its garage.
- Set up the lawn tractor for snowblowing.

We have the physical plant in good operating condition and repair.

Chris Lamberton has expressed interest in obtaining a defibrillator for the church and would like to have CPR training offered for ushers. This will be one of our goals for the coming year.

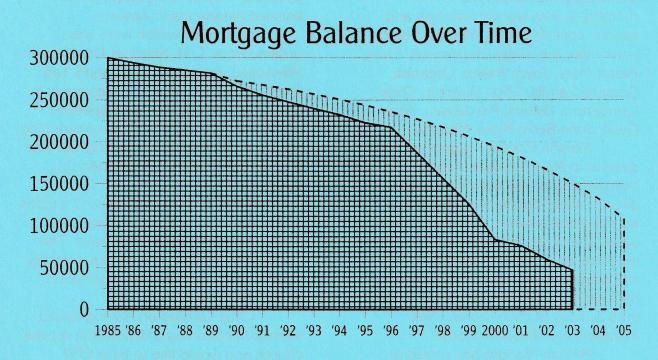
Another goal for 2004 is to add another member to the committee who would coordinate details for special/festival worship services such as Reformation and Pentecost.

We also have some great volunteers this year that have committed their time to the Sunday School hour: Carol Yust and Gregg Albright (Middle

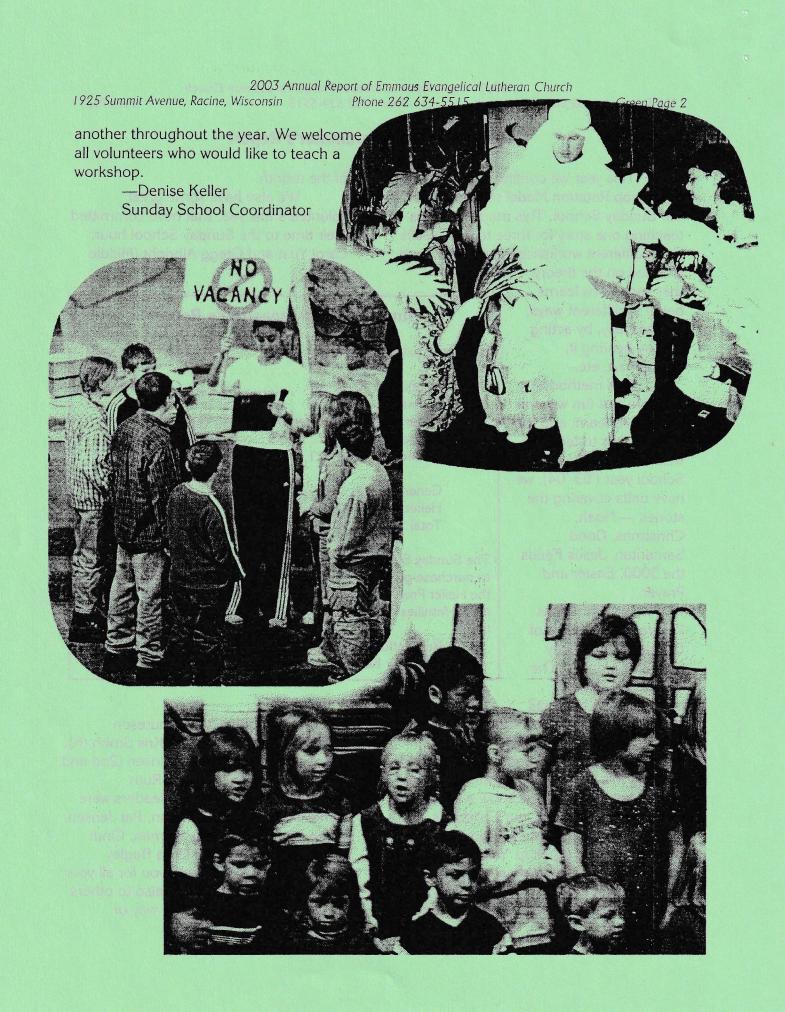

Emmaus Kids Hope USA Coordinator's Report

The 2003-2004 school year marks the fourth year of our partnership with Wadewitz Elementary School. The partnership began in 2000 by an invitation from the principal, Pat Limburg for Emmuas to provide mentors for first graders at the school. Marty Aiken turned that invitation into a mentoring program affiliated with the Kids USA program.

Marty had to leave the Emmaus mentoring program when he and his wife moved to Japan this fall. I have attempted to continue the program in Marty's absence, but it has not proved to be a smooth transition.

The mentoring program began three years ago with a partnership of mentors and first graders. The second and third years of participation expanded into the third and fourth grade classrooms of Wadewitz as mentors followed their students on to the next grade. Mrs. Limburg did not think there was a need for mentoring in the fourth grade and requested that mentors focus their attention on the first, second, and third grades only.

Many mentors, who had been with the program for three years and had followed their students through the third grade, decided they needed a break before taking on a new student. Several of the mentors had left the area or had taken on new jobs that did not allow them the flexibility to visit the school at mentoring times.

There is still a great level of commitment from the mentors and

cooperation from the school. We simply are mentoring fewer students. Most of the students are in first and second grade and two students are in fourth. There are twelve active mentors and four substitute mentors.

Wadewitz began a new reading program this year that removed some of the flexibility out of their schedule. There are large blocks of time when they do not want the students removed from the classroom for mentoring. This does limit the times we can mentor.

We are welcomed and appreciated at the school. Mrs Jaskulske has been very helpful with the mentoring program and as a liaison with the after school program. We are very recognizable at the school and the students have a very positive perception of the "church people".

The mentoring program is still a success, but has suffered from a change of management, scheduling, and longevity. The desired effect of Emmaus being a neighborhood church and involved in community is still being accomplished. Our partnership with Wadewitz school and it's staff is stronger than ever.

Another example of the strong relationship is the growth of our after school program and the support we receive from Wadewitz school.

Emmaus After School for Youth

The 2003-2004 after school program began the first week of October. Mrs. Jaskulske from Wadewitz school distributed invitations to our program to all the students at the school. This relationship with the school has grown over the years and I know we are perceived by the staff as competent and helpful neighbors. This support has greatly benefited our programs.

We made a few changes in our program this year. We now employ two teen interns to work five hours a week with the children. These staff members are from Emmaus and were well trained during Neighborhood Camp this summer. This staff change has enabled us to double the number of children who attend, while still maintaining a safe and nurturing environment for tutoring and play.

There have been 25 children involved with the program. Three children have moved away from Racine, but there are students ready to take their place. We have an amazing attendance rate. Usually a student misses only if ill.

An intern and I wait at the school every Tuesday and Thursday to walk the children to the church. We greet students and teachers as we wait for all our attendees to congregate by the front doors. This has proven to be a wonderful opportunity to witness our commitment to these children. As all of us walk together to the church we see other children who ask, "Where are you going?"

"We're going to the church down the street!' is always the response.

I'm often asked if someone new can join us. I think this program has wonderful potential for growth.

This year we also started a different type of reading program. Several members from the congregation come for a half-hour on Tuesdays to read with the children. This has been a wonderful

gift to these students. They beg to read to an adult! These dedicated adults have given some muchneeded individual time to a child and impressed upon them the importance of reading. God bless them!

The opportunity to impact these children in this program is tremendous. With twenty children in the program, there is an opportunity to develop real relationships over the course of the year. There is a real opportunity to witness, a real opportunity to make an impact.

Many of the after school children go on to become involved in the Neighborhood Camp program in the summer. Some also have become involved in our Sunday school program.

I think we have reached out to the community through this program. We are very visible to the school, the community and have made a difference to children with real needs. My hope for this program is that it can be expanded to three days and hopefully offered to more students.

Neighborhood Camp Coordinator's Report

This summer seven churches opened their doors and became sites for the nearly 200 children that attended the Racine ELCA Neighborhood Camps.

The shared ministry of these churches was solidified during the weekly meetings that took place three and a half

months before camp started. These meetings produced curriculum ideas and resources, field trip ideas, resource persons, food resources, staff, and training ideas. The different sites worked together sharing equipment, staff and ideas. This process was a collaborative effort that produced wonderful communication and relationships among the

different ELCA churches in Racine.

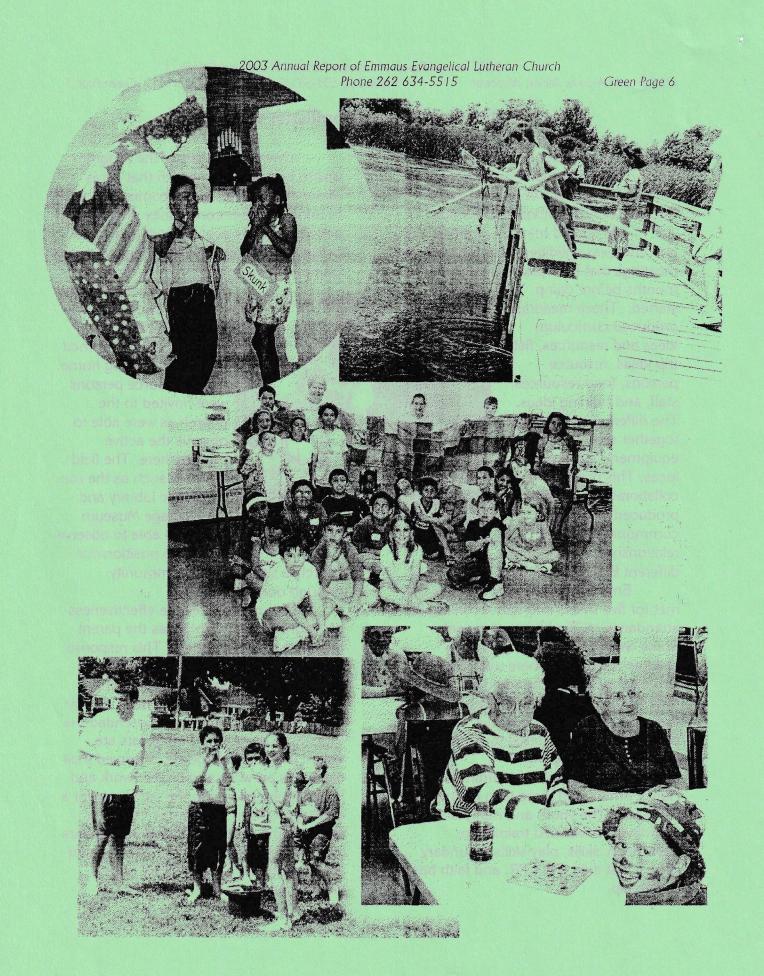
Emmaus was one of the sites that met for five weeks and had a consistent attendance of 25 children per week. Some weeks saw as many as thirty children attending. There were also approximately three hundred volunteer hours logged in by the congregation over the course of those five weeks. This camp was well supported by Emmaus and continues to grow.

There was a site coordinator, Nancy Smith, and three teen interns at Emmaus. The youth and many of the site coordinators received training in: supervisory skills, play skills, boundary issues, first aide and CPR, and faith based leadership. One of the goals of the program was to be seen as a church that cares about the children in our community and to bring together community resources to accomplish this goal. A quilt was made by the children at Emmaus Neighborhood Camp and was given to the Women's

Shelter of Racine. The campers also put together a day long program and performed for a local nursing home. Many resource persons were invited to the church as were able to observe the active ministry here. The field trip sites such as the zoo, the Public Library and the Heritage Museum were also able to observe the active position our

church is taking in the community through our programs.

One measure of the effectiveness of Neighborhood Camp was the parent response to the program. This response was measured quite favorably at the closing program and picnic held at the end of the five weeks at Emmaus. Eighty family members and friends attended the three-hour program. The guests ate, visited the meeting rooms, observed their children's art work and project work and joined their children in the sanctuary for a closing program with pastor Mary, the staff and the children. These participants were introduced to the church, its pastor and the interest Emmaus has in their children and in them.



My goal for the Neighborhood Camp program is that it continue to grow and that more Emmaus members can become involved in this wonderful program that brings God's needy children to His church.

The past year has brought its share of success and challenges! It is never short of amazing to be part of a miracle in progress.

Racine Vocational Ministry, Inc. (RVM) has completed its first full fiscal year. We are definitely forming our own personality and direction. Sadly, our mentor organization ceased operation, but fortunately RVM had begun to take on a personality of its own prior to that.

Some of the notable achievements are:

RVM successfully attained its independent 501 (c) 3 status. We have also been granted sales tax exemption through the State of Wisconsin.

As of the writing of this report, 291 individuals have been assisted in finding employment through our agency.

RVM has cultivated much support from local churches, funders and agencies. RVM's employer partners have grown substantially in the last year also. Our current employers are; All Saints' Healthcare Systems, Lincoln Lutheran Home, SpeedTech, Int., Express Personnel, Quizno's, the City of Racine, Racine Public Library, Safe Haven, Siena Center, Bank of Elmwood, Monroe Services, Racine Journal Times, MacPhail Restoration, Pick 'n' Save, Midwest Airlines, YMCA, Jewel-Osco, St. Luke's Episcopal Church, Lakeview Rehabilitation Services and Midwest

Express.

RVM recently became a United Way of Racine County agency.

As a member of the Homeless Assistance Coalition, RVM was awarded a grant through the Federal Government's Housing and Urban Development Continuum of Care grant for our work with the homeless population in Racine County.

As a member of the Racine County Family Violence Community Coalition, RVM is currently working on a grant for a Family Justice Center through the Federal Government's Department of Justice.

We have been blessed to be the topic of a documentary, which is currently in the filming stages. A Madison production company became intrigued by RVM and began filming participants, staff, the Solutions For Success workshop and one-on-one vocational counseling sessions. This will continue for approximately ten more months, following participants through the challenges and successes of their life journey and partnership with RVM.

Our first annual event was held in June, 2003, and was attended by nearly 100 people. We celebrated the success of many participants and showed appreciation to our employers and supporters. The next event will be held in April, 2004. We look forward to seeing you there.

In this past year, Solutions For Success workshops have been conducted or sponsored by Emmanuel Lutheran, Emmaus Lutheran, Holy Communion, Lutheran Church of the Redeemer, Zion

Lutheran, St. Luke's Episcopal, St. Michael's Episcopal, Homeward Bound of Racine County, Vet's Place Southern Center, Good Samaritan Center and St. Paul Missionary Baptist Church.

This year we are spreading our wings, and moving further out into the county. Love, Inc. in Burlington is our newest friend, and we look forward to getting to know and becoming partners with participants, agencies and employers in western Racine County.

We are realizing that we are in severe need of volunteer office support.

We feel that one of the main challenges facing us, is manpower. Although our agency is small, with the number of participants and their unique needs, sometimes it becomes difficult to get phones answered, address individuals face to face, and answer the door! 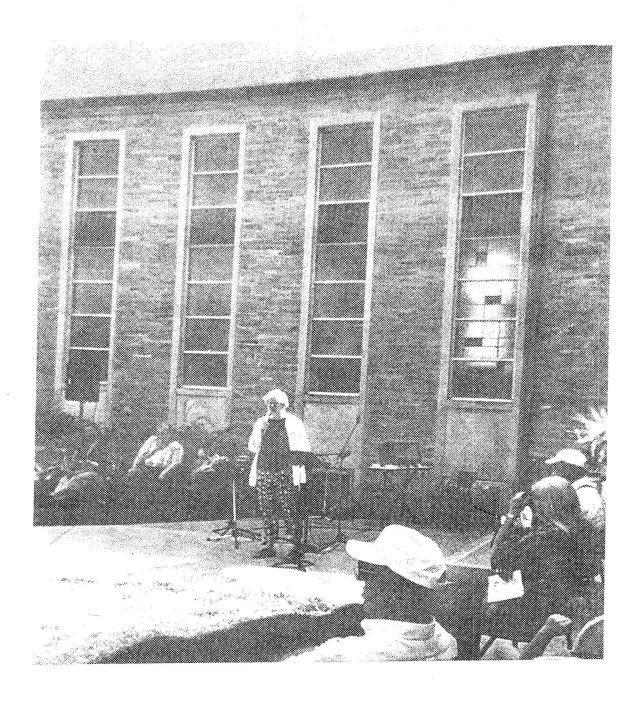

2004 Budget Proposal

Notes of Explanation

General Notes:

The Council is proposing a semi-annual budget as the budget is not balanced and is not within an obtainable status. The overall annual budget depicts a \$14,198 deficit stemming from the following:

- 1. Loss of YWCA income \$4,000
- 2. Sunday School Director \$4,800. This was part of outreach; however, it may no longer be classified as such because the program is well established.
- 3. Salary increases \$3,000

The budget forecasted is an accurate presentation based on previous year's income and expenses and has been adjusted for the items mentioned above. We are very comfortable with the projected numbers and believe that the estimated difference will be obtainable for the first six months of the year. In June the budget will need to be revisited to seek alternative solutions if we fall behind considerable. Some expenses are set for exact amount and timing while other amounts depict estimates from income and expenses over the past years. Again we believe it is very realistic and accurate, but has it shortfalls.

Specific Notes by Line Item:

4011: We are projecting \$165,700: \$140,700 given by pledging members and \$25,000 given by non-pledging

members for 2004. The monthly totals shown reflect the averages given per month over the past several years.

4027: We are anticipating once again lower income in the summer months; thus have added an Adopt-a-bill program for \$500 for July.

4041: We have only budgeted 4 months of rental income at \$475 due to the financial situation with the daycare. We would have increased the rent to \$500 thus we have a deficit of \$4,000 in planned income from the Daycare

6061: Our regular benevolence will again be 7% for the Greater Milwaukee Synod

6121: Pastor Mary's base salary has increase of 9% based on her tenure status within the Ministry.

6172-6174 & 6176: A 3% raise will be given to all other employees (excl Outreach empl & SS)

6510: The mortgage payment slightly lower from \$966 per month to \$700 to help cover some of these expenses. We still estimate to pay an additional \$125 month towards the load principal.

7479: The outreach program will need to be evaluated in June to determine if any grant monies will be available to continue the programs.
