### HAPPY NEW YEAR!



But how will 1983 be "happy" and in what sense might it be "new?" I think the two come together in the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The word "happy" is the translation the Good News Bible and J. B. Phillips give to the key word in the Beatitude that other versions of Matthew 5 show as "blessed." The ones who are blessed have exacty opposite of what we ordinarily think as making people happy. Jesus describes the "happy" ones as being

spiritually poor, in mourning, having a humble attitude, not seeking their own ends first, and suffering insult and persecution for his sake. How can this be?

I think the key is something "new" breaking into their lives. It is the Lord himself who enters in and does as he promises, "See! I am making all things new (Rev. 21:5).

He makes not only a new heaven and a new earth someday. He transforms people into new persons now. The artificial heart of Barney Clark is a scientific wonder. The "new heart" that God fashions and implants is a great miracle.

Let us not give up on others nor on ourselves. Jesus doesn't.



### BOOK NOOK REVIEW

"Single Again - This Time With Children" by Alice Stolper Peppler

If you are a single parent who's wondering what you can do for yourself and your children, this book will help you find some new and meaningful ways to live a more fulfilled life as a Christian parent.

Mrs. Peppler tells the emotional stages children go thru after the loss of a parent, how to form family councils, how to maintain discipline, guidelines for working with an ex-mate, and ideas for personal growth.

I found it interesting reading. Mrs. Peppler - a twice divorced mother of three - isn't one of these preachy sociologist types who speak from "studies", she's been "there." She shares what she's learned personally and what has worked for her family.

I would suggest this book for any single parent & although it's aimed mainly at the divorced parent I think all single parents can learn something from it.







They will furnish part of the food items as well as 3 or 4 workers. We welcome their assistance and look forward to our first combined effort on Thursday, February 3rd.

A special "thank you" is extended to Ray & Myrna Olesen who, through their O & H Bakery, furnish all of the bread that is used for all the meals...on every Thursday, all of the participating churches express appreciation.

Here are portions of a letter from the national offices of the American Lutheran Church. It reports the results of 1982 contributions through the ALC.

There is good news to share.

With joy and thanksgiving we share the good news that contributions from the 4,865 congregations which comprise the ALC family came to \$32,128,318, a 4.9% increase over the previous fiscal year.

In addition, contributions for the Seminary Appeal during the past fiscal year totaled \$9,057,720, and the special gifts beyond the ALC budget for World Hunger provided \$2,913,613 for this purpose.

In spite of difficulties, for the first time in many years, our increased giving for ALC mission and ministry - 4.9% - exceeded the national increase - 3.9% - of the Consumer Price Index. Through your gifts you touched many lives with your love and with Christ's love.

Thank you for your giving that helped make these fine results.

Arnold Toynbee was a famous 20th century British historian who described the rise and fall of civilizations in terms of challenge and response. Perhaps the theme could be used to portray a congregation.

There is no question that Emmaus faces a great opportunity as it hears and heeds the Lord's call to serve his people and world in 1983. Inherent with his gracious call is the challenge to respond in positive ways. "Go...make disciples...baptize...teach." The Great Commission of Jesus (Matthew 28:19-20) issues in the particular missions of thousands of congregations.

Your church council will be meeting in retreat on Saturday, June 4th, to review and update the mission statement of Emmaus. When we know what we want to say about 1) who we are and 2) what we want to do we will better be able to determine emphases and methods that will shape many things, e.g.: the building program, Christian education for children and adults, stewardship possibilities, worship services (remember the goals of 10% increase in attendance), outreach ministries, etc.

One challenge looming large already is the general budget. We do not have an impossible budget, unless we choose to make it so. But it will take some change in giving patterns, especially by those who could give more, if we are to close the gap of some \$5,000 in the next six months. Won't you join me and give deliberately (through prayer and meditation), generously, and, thank-fully?

As we face Emmaus' challenges, let us claim the promise of the last words of our Lord in the Great Commission:
"...l am with you always, to the close of the age."






# COUNCIL VOTES TO BACK BUILDING PROGRAM

At the conclusion of its retreat at Carthage College on June 4th, the Emmaus Church Council voted formally to support and promote the Building Program of the congregation. This action came at the conclusion of six hours of deliberation on the mission of Emmaus.

The decision does not mean an endorsement of a particular building plan. That will come later as a recommendation to the congregation for a final vote, projected for this fall.


The Building Committee presently has Architectural Associates Ltd., on hold until a study of the sources of financial support can be completed. Then a total cost figure will be given the architects to consider in completing a detailed plan.

The last quarter of the year 1983 is upon us. Your stewardship committee, council and pastors have thought that come fall, we as a congregation, would be taking major strides to make up the distance between what we need for our over-all mission (budget) and what has actually been given. To do so, we need to average \$3,800 per week in offerings in October, November and December - or about \$1,600 more per week than realized to date.

Please consider with us your own answers to some

basic questions as we begin this final quarter:

1) What is my attitude towards my money? Is it an idol, something I depend on more than God? Will I let money be a servant, something I gladly give to spread the gospel, God's love in Christ?

2) If I have pledged to give to God through Emmaus this year, have I been keeping that pledge? If not,

why not?

3) If I have not pledged but give anyway (40% still respond this way), do I know what I am giving and what I can give? Am I deliberate about it? Can I give more?

4) Have I really been giving as the Lord has blessed me? If I have regular income, does my giving reflect this? And if I received a raise in salary and/or benefits, have I increased my giving accordingly?

The thoughtful, prayerful answers of each member are important. The offerings will be the answers translated into action,

"The first thing expressed in my seal is a cross, black, within the heart, to put me in mind that faith

in Christ crucified saves us. For with the heart man believeth unto righteousness'. \*\* Now, although the cross is black, mortified, and intended to cause pain, yet it does not change the colour of the heart, does not destroy nature - i.e., does not kill, but keeps alive. 'For the just shall live by faith,' - by faith in the Saviour. \*\*\* But this heart is fixed upon the centre of a white rose, to show that faith causes joy, consolation and peace. 



# BISHOPS' RETURN FROM BRAZIL and CENTRAL AMERICA

"I saw the Church in action." Bishop A.C. Schumacher said; describing his experiences in Brazil and Central America to the District Theological Conference participants. 

We will begin immediately on the establishment of our Capitol Fund Drive and the finalization of our building plans.


