CALL COMMITTEE REPORT

The Emmaus Church Council and Call Committee met with Harold Kuehn. Assistant to the Bishop of the Southern Wisconsin District - ALC on February 14th. Mr. Kuehn outlined the steps and options available to Emmaus in the selection of an associate pastor. Members of Emmaus were asked to complete a "Survey of Ministry" form during both services on February 26th. The results of this survey were forwarded to the District Office for analysis. On March 8th, Rev. Marshall Pechauer, Assistant to the Bishop, will meet with the Call Committee, Personnel Committee and leaders of the congregation to go over the analysis and develop a "Profile of Skills and Qualifications". This profile will list the qualities which members of Emmaus feel are necessary in an associate pastor. The District Office will then give the Call Committee a list of pastors available for Call who fit our profile. A copy of the profile will be published so that members of Emmaus will be aware of the results of the "Survey of Ministry" form. The members of the Call Committee welcome your questions, suggestions, concerns, etc. Please feel free to contact us: Rhoda Adelsen (chairman). Peter Baylon, Sandy Strini, Glenn Olson, Nancy Martinsen & Pastor Rossing (advisor).. The BUILDING FUND THERMOMETER keeps rising. Three-year pledges and gifts now total \$175,000. 

RESULTS. "SURVEY OF MINISTRY" RESULTS

At services on Sunday, February 26th, worshippers completed a Survey of Ministry form supplied by the District Office. The results were compiled by the Call Committee and have been interpreted now by the District Office. These results will be considered by the Call Committee in building a profile of the kind of pastorate desired at Emmaus. The interpreted results follow:

All of the questions from the survey fall into five categories of congregational life:

- * Enriching Personal Faith (questions 14, 18, 20 & 25)
- * Practicing Effective Leadership (questions 3, 6, 7, 13 & 21)
- * Caring for People Outside the Congregation (questions 4, 10, 11, 15 & 22)
- * Expressing Our Particular Christian Heritage (questions 2, 5, 8, 16 & 24)
- * Creating Christian Community (questions 1, 9, 12, 17, 19 & 23)

GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

- 1. Of the five categories Creating Community seems to be of primary importance to the congregation. This would indicate that the building and maintaining of community or fellowship is important and should be continued into the future.
- 2. The category which seems to be of the lowest importance to the congregation was the Caring for People Outside the Congregation. The purpose of a congregation is the nuture of its members; However the gospel compels us to be concerned for those outside. Why is this concern of low priority?

SPECIFIC OBSERVATIONS

1. The members are saying that they find their friends from within the congregation and that this is important. It appears that to the members Emmaus is more than a place to come once a week.

- 2. The members do indicate a high concern for youth, yet there is perhaps a concern with the way in which the youth ministry has been accomplished to date.
- 3. There appears to be a desire by the members for assistance in the following perceived important issues: Strengthening of family life, sharing Christ with others, and more adult education classes.
- 4. The members felt the celebrating of the sacraments (which often refers to the worship life) is important and being accomplished well.
- 5. It is also interesting to note that having pastoral visits is not important. Also that although the congregation does a good job in providing support during times of crisis or stress, it is not perceived as being important.

President Martinsen led the congregation through a special meeting that resulted in a positive vote for the building program on Sunday morning, May 13th. He outlined the steps that have been taken recently:

-completing of "The Road To Emmaus" fund drive that resulted in over \$206,000 in pledges and gifts.

-finishing of the detailed drawings by Architectural Associates.

-updated analyzing of the congregation's financial situation and potential.

There was discussion by members of the congregation about some specific areas of the proposed design and the financial plan.

The meeting concluded with the vote on the motion to proceed with the program:


- 1. Get bids and make cuts that reduce the project by \$44,000 (from \$560,000 to \$516,000).
- 2. Initiate a mortgage bond program with members of the congregation.
- 3. Arrange for balance of mortgage with Lutheran Brotherhood.

The result of the vote was 68 for and 25 against, 3 undecided, a majority of 73% in favor.

After two marvelous years serving as a Peace Corps Volunteer in Sierra Leone, West Africa it feels good to be reunited with family and old friends.

A few months ago I wrote to all of you at Emmaus asking for help in building a primary school in the village of Makarankay. The money was to be used to put a permanent roof on their building. I asked for \$900, hoping for at least enough to get a good start. Boy, was I surprised! The money I received totalled nearly \$1.800.00.

As I originally advised you, the first \$900 went to put a roof on the building. From there we were able to purchase enough materials to put in a concrete floor, concrete plastered walls, some desks and even a latrine for the school. But wait, there was still money coming in !!!

Another Peace Corps Volunteer was in the process of building a secondary school classroom building, but had run short on funds after construction was 3/4 completed. The extra funds I had, along with a generous contribution of materials by the Catholic Church of Sierra Leone, enabled her to complete the project.



Emmaus took the big step to approve the resolution of a \$300,000 loan from Lutheran Brotherhood and accept the costs of \$582,000 on the proposed addition. Of those present and voting (91) at a special meeting of the congregation on Sunday, October 14th, 79% said "Yes" to the proposition. This is the largest majority of all the congregational votes on the building program.

President Jim Martinsen chaired the meeting. Al Svendsen, Building Committee Chairman and John Murphy, architect, reviewed the project and with President Martinsen, answered questions from the voters.

Among other items it was reported that \$37,000 has been received so far from members for the Investment Loan Program. The goal is to realize \$120,000 by January 31, 1985.

Excavating and laying of forms by Bukacek Construction Company began a few days after the congregational meeting. The favorable votes are being translated into visible action. Emmaus is well "on the road".





On Tuesday, November 20th, President - Jim Martinsen, Treasurer - Glenn Christiansen, Attorney - John Knuteson and Pastor Lyle Rossing met with representatives of the Heritage Bank and the Ambassador Title Company to conclude negotiations for interim financing, a \$300,000 construction loan. This money will be drawn as needed to pay the contractors, after Emmaus' own reserves in the Building Fund have been used. Interest is at floating prime rate and will be paid only on the amounts drawn from the loan, as the loan is utilized in a master note arrangement.

This favorable plan means that the more members of Emmaus contribute to the Building Fund during the construction of the addition, the less interest and principal there will be to repay.

Emmaus presently has \$115,000 that can be used for building purposes, after paying the first bill of \$34,000. The \$115,000 balance and other gifts that come in for the addition will be expended before Emmaus draws on the \$300.00 loan.


