

This year will be exciting for Emmaus. In late Spring we expect to be able to use our new addition. The expanded classrooms will be put to good use by both our Sunday School and our Vacation Church School. Our Adult Forum group is looking forward to the larger multi-purpose room in the new addition. The addition of the elevator will help all of us. The new administrative office area will also help Emmaus carry out our ministry.

Each of us can be proud of our contribution toward a more effective ministry from Emmaus. This benevolence will benefit all who attend Emmaus, and those who come after us. We are doing our Lord's work.

We expect our addition to be essentially complete by early May. At that time we will need to secure our permanent financing.

- How each of us who have pledged has done against our original pledge.
- 2. To develop a special program for all new members,
- 3. To develop new plans for funding to close the "gap" prior to May 1, 1985.

I encourage you to support the Finance Committee as they attempt to solve this important issue for Emmaus.

Emmaus is your church. You must help to make sure that Emmaus continues to grow spiritually and physically to continue to do our Lord's work.







Is it tough to get yourself and your family up and ready for Sunday morning worship? We are creatures of habit, good or bad. At first it takes some discipline and organiza-

tion to change a pattern of behavior that will yield positive results. That's the case with preparing for Sunday morning worship.

We can benefit from an article in The Lutheran (April 17, 1985), entitled "When Sunday Mornings Won't Start" by Don Ringler. Some steps that he and his family have taken to make for a better worship experience may help us.

- 1. Realize a change is necessary. Develop a worship attitude as you get yourself and the family ready. Don't rely on erasing two hours of frustration and tension during a walk from the parked car.
- 2. Begin preparing for worship Saturday night. chores such as baths, washing hair and planning wha to wear then. Set the breakfast table. Fill offer ing envelopes. Go to bed early so you wake up feel ing refreshed and ready.
- 3. Get up early enough Sunday morning so that . necessary morning activities can be completed on time and in unhurried fashion.
- 4. Start out the morning in anticipation of worsh ping God. Realize the purpose of worship. Have family eat breakfast together and share their anticipations for worship and Sunday School.
- 5. Realize Satan has a hand in making your Sunday morning chaotic. He wants to mess us up so we won't be in an attitude that would be worshipful.
- 6. Involve the entire family in discussions that recognize the need for changes to be made in the Sunday routine and in planning those changes. Pray about them. Plan your work. Then work your plan.

Lots of good ideas are here that may help us approach worship in a ready frame of mind. I would add one more. very important item: Pray for those leading worship readers, assistants, choirs and soloists, acolytes. ushers, story tellers, and pastor(s) - that the Holy Spirit may use them to enable meaningful and effective worship by the whole congregation. - Pastor Rossing -

REPORT

... ADULT FORUM SURVEY

Members have been completing Adult Forum questionnaires over the past five weeks.

Out of an average attendance of 25 at the Forum, 14 completed the forms, or 56%. Most of these who responded are between 30 and 50 years old. Attendance regularity among the 14 respondents shows: 7 attend very often. 5 attend half the time, I attends occasionally and I attends depending on the topic.

These persons preferred the following answers in the questionnaire:


- 1. The objectives of the Adult Forum should be two-fold: to gain information and understanding of a current topic and to focus on particular books and/or themes of the Bible. Close behind these primary objectives is: to promote fellowship and conversation.
- 2. The most interesting and helpful topics to present are: (1) social issues and (2) biblical themes or subjects. These coincide with the primary objectives above. Also of interest to the respondents is: (3) ministry and work of helping agencies.
- 3. The format desired by far (9 of the 14) is one-half resource or presentation and one-half discussion.
- 4. A majority of the respondents (57%) said "Yes", they would like to have the choice of a Bible Study offered at the same time as the Forum in a different room.

These results will provide a new basis for developing the Adult Forum by the Planning Committee - Lyle Andersen, Mildred Schroth, Jan Sukus and Pastor Rossing, advisor, If you have ideas to share, please talk to one of these persons.





Although our run is going well, I do not have any financial results at the time of this writing.

It has been brought to my attention that there are some of you who have been expecting another building fund pledge drive. I honestly have to say I had not expected to have such a drive. As I stated in my October "Visitor" letter, we all have to increase our giving (maybe \$20.00-\$30.00 or more per month) to meet our annual budget, benevolences and our additional mortgage payment. For those of you who may not be aware of our monthly mortgage payment, it is \$2,800.00 per month, every month, for 30 years (just like a house payment). We also must pay off several loans that were made to us by fellow members.

We can use the building fund envelopes in the pews at anytime for gifts, memorials, etc. to support the financial commitment of our new addition. In the near future we hope to give you the exact figures of our building fund program.

For those of you who would like to pledge money to the building fund, pledge cards will be made available in the church office. Please pick one up, fill it out and return to the church office by December 31st.


