



THE PASTOR'S MESSAGE

This is the Lenten season of the church year. The evangelical emphasis upon Lent is in harmony with the great fact of atonement. The Christian church is called upon to rethink and restate, seriously, the meaning of the cross. It is not called upon to make some superficial manipulations of things or time which may have nothing to do with faith in Christ and Him crucified.

Certainly the great facts of the life, suffering and death of Christ, upon which alone our salvation is based, are reasons for serious contemplation and devotion. It is in keeping therewith that we urge full attendance at our church services. Let us respond to the message of Lent. The Sunday morning worship and the Wednesday evening service should be faithfully attended.

This is no idle plea. There can be no Christian life without the hearing of the Word of God. There are legitimate excuses, but despising and belittling the preaching of God's Word are sins against the Sabbath Day and one's own soul. This season should give many parents an occasion to start going with their children to the church services. You can say, "This is Lent. Let's all go to church today." If necessary, let the parents alternate in going. The worship of God is good for the soul. It is the soul that counts. God cannot bless us if we are negligent.

I have indicated that Lent demands sober thinking about the great themes of our faith. It also requires of us a joyous acceptance of salvation. No matter how somber the cross may appear on Calvary, it is the good news of redemption. Good news should bring a joyous response.

Sin certainly comes under judgment at the cross of Christ. There Jesus bore our sins upon His own body. We ought to be deeply stirred with repentance for all our sins. We should confess with remorse in order that we may have forgiveness.

Forgiveness is also the message of the Cross. By the grace of God, and through faith in Christ, we may have peace and joy and freedom from guilt. Many of us need to catch up on repentance and faith. We have been so indifferent that we are in danger of losing sight of the great salvation which is the good news of Lent. What Christ offers is eternal life. "There is therefore now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

Appointment of the members of this committee was confirmed by the congregation.

Also at this meeting, Pastor Petersen presented his annual report to the congregation in the form in which it appeared in the February issue of the Emmaus Messenger.

Auditors' reports approved the books of Treasurer C. C. Christensen and Financial Secretary Fred Christensen.

The annual reports of the Treasurer and the Financial Secretary were read and approved.

It was announced that the synodical convention in June, 1950, will be held in Hutchinson, Minnesota. An effort was made at this meeting to select a delegate from Emmaus, it having been voted to send one representative officially from the congregation. However, since this matter could not be immediately resolved, it was decided to postpone the selection of a delegate until the April meeting of the congregation.

President Anderson again stressed the importance of discharging the debt on the church's new oil burner through church envelope contributions specifically identified for that purpose.
