PASTOR'S REPORT

I Corinthians 1:9 - "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord."

Dear Member of Emmaus:

"Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ."

No truer statement could be made. It is a fact, "God is faithful". It is true as we look back upon the past, and it is a wonderful promise in which we can have confidence in the future. God's faithfulness toward us is more than we deserve. Without His loving regard for His Church, its fellowship and service would soon faulter. It is God who blesses us with the privilege of participation in His Kingdom. It is with thanksgiving that we praise Him for the year that has past and with prayer that we seek to heed His calling and guidance in the new year.

While we have cause to thank God for His faithfulness in granting us His Gospel and Sacraments of Grace in this past year, we would do well to more fully acknowledge His appeal to us. As Paul says, it is by His faithfulness and patience to each of us that we are called "into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord". Our part in this fellowship is also important. Recently we sent for a little fiber gear which needed to be replaced in our aging 16 MM Motion Picture Projector. It was just a matter of a few little teeth in the gear that were striped. Yet, this was enough to cause the whole projector to cease operating. Each member of a congregation is like a tooth in this little fiber gear. What about your function in the fellowship? Has it been, and will it be all that God desires?

Now that we are casting away the calendar of 1959 and puting in the new ones in their place, we note that many marks have been made upon their pages. Last year's pages bear the record of a normal and steady increase in total and average attendance at regular worship services. Participation in Holy Communion showed a small gain. The surge of growth in Sunday School and interest in Adult Bible Study has offered encouragement. Indications toward even greater numerical gains are much in evidence.

Our work among you as pastor and the fellowship we have shared in the congregation as a family has brought many blessings. We want to thank all who continued in prayer for us. Our sincere appreciation is expressed for the thoughtfulness of the Church Council and Congregation in giving a very understanding adjustment in the pastor's car allowance. We realize and appreciate that other needs in our ministry are being given consideration. Secretarial help and office equipment have been patiently awaited while funds were needed to make regular payments on our Building Debt and Mission Quota. We look forward to the day of less strain and tension as a better understanding of stewardship by all members is practiced.

Again this year many willing hearts and hands helped to perform the tasks of our congregation. Naming all the individuals who have

given unselfishly of their time and efforts would be impossible and by them especially regarded unnecessary. Included are members of the Church Council and committees. The Sunday School Teachers and Vacation Church School Teachers, the organist, the choir directors and members of the choirs, the youth councelors and the helpers doing the clerical work, stenographic work and the mailing details and those who have assisted in maintenance and cleaning of the Church property. No one knows better the joy and satisfaction that is found in serving the Lord than those who have so generously contributed their time and ability. They have also caused the operation cost of our congregation to be only about one half of the local expense in other congregations of a simular size.

Only the pastor, the senior choir director, the janitor and a brief service of a Secretary-Parish Worker received compensation. In the case of the latter a word of explaination is in order. Miss Valeria Gerlt, a well trained and consecrated Christian parish worker and teacher who was awaiting an assignment as a Missionary-teacher in Japan under the J 3 Program, consented to help us during the very busy fall season. She was provided room and board by the pastor's family which was certainly their pleasure. For her devoted service during seven weeks Valeria was compensated by the congregation to the amount indicated in the treasurer's report (\$200) which is the first money used of the amount allowed for secretarial assistance to the pastor (\$600 per year) for the past two years. Her report to the congreation is very worthy of your attention.

It might be noted with interest that this year the increase in average attendance per Sunday is by coincidence exactly the same as in the past two years. (34)

At our Fourth Anniversary of the dedication of our church an all congregational program was enjoyed, that is no guest speaker was here for the occasion. A panel discussion shared by organizational leaders proved very interesting. Guest pastors who brought us the Gospel at various services were: Pastor E. R. Andersen, our veteran pastor and member of Emmaus; Pastor Norman Langholtz, ALC Staff of Parish Education representative; Pastor Donald Olson of Camp Douglas, Wisconsin; Pastor Walter Kloetzli, Executive-secretary of Urban Church Planning, NLC; Pastor John Wagner, associate to Pastor Kloetzli; Pastor E. T. Boe, Lutheran Welfare Society of Wisconsin and Chaplain at Eau Claire, Wisconsin.

Our Mid-Week Lenten Services were conducted under the theme:
"The Company At The Cross". One of the services, sponsored by the Senior Luther League, presented an inspiring film, "Gates Of Glory". Pastor E. R. Andersen conducted one service also. A coffee fellowship was served by the various Guilds and Men of Emmaus after the services. Holy Thursday and Good Friday were observed with special services, as were the Days of Epiphany and Ascension. We have continued patiently our Mid-week Adult Bible Study hoping that an interest might blossom forth as well as knowing it to be a good

personal discipline. We have shared the Gospel of Mark in recent months and now we are beginning a study in the Epistle of James. Sunday Morning Adult Bible Class shows real encouragement at times. Our studies have been based on the Sunday School Lesson for the day.

Our Holy Communion record total was 2508 communions served at 14 services and 115 individuals. This is a small increase over last year though we had two less services. Our grief is still the fact that all together too many confirmed members of our congregation are negligent about their partaking of our Lord's strength-giving sacrament for their spiritual blessing.

A good report of our Cradle Roll Department is offered elsewhere in this publication. Statisticly we might note that 99 little tots are enrolled. The report will also indicate that our workers have been doing a good job. An annual Fellowship was sponsored during November and a Cradle Roll Messenger was published. The latter is a new project. The little ones have also been supplied nursery care at all services by the Junior Guild and Cradle Roll Workers.

Our Sunday School of 317 pupils, 36 teachers and workers, plus our Adult Bible Class has experienced a number of adjustments this year. Many of the problems are challenges which result from our "Growing Pains". These adjustments are gradually being made and we must be prepared to make many more in the future. Again last fall a Sunday School T acher's Training Institute was conducted by the leaders of the Board of Parish Education of the merging Synods with other Racine TALC Churches. Sunday School Staffs benefited from the field testing of their proposed material for 1960 Institutes. We were proud of the attendance record of our Emmaus Teachers. We are grateful for the assistance which parents of children enrolled in our Sunday School are giving. We are certain that even greater consciousness for the financial support of our Sunday School will be manifested.

During the days of August 10 to 21 our Vacation Church School was held. About 200 pupils attended with an average daily attendance of 176 and 73 pupils had a perfect attendance record which included attendance at church and Sunday School on the Sunday between the two weeks of school. A one hundred dollar offering was given for the Sudan Mission in Nigeria, Africa. We are indeed grateful for the capable and willing leadership and cooperation from all the teachers.

Extra effort and increased interest has made Luther League more like it should be. As cooperation and assistance continues to grow Leaguers will go forward to accept greater challenges and the deepening of their spiritual life through this fellowship. Some of our Leaguers attended the National Convention at Blair and the District Convention at Denmark, Wisconsin as well as a special "What and How" Rally at Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Projects of raising funds for the Shadow Lake Retreat and the sale of Christmas Chimes were undertaken.

We would like to see the Junior Luther League re-activated, which should represent a real challenge to some volunteer leader. An investment of time and talent in this enterprize would surely be very rewarding.

The organizations of the Women have followed the plans and practices of the past years. Several interesting programs were shared by Guilds, Women's Missionary Society and Ladies Aid. The suggestion of re-organizing into the plan of the Women Of The Church as proposed by the merging Church is being studied. Many of the interesting programs supplimented the Bible Study of the Letter to the Ephesians as suggested by the merging Synods for the Women of the Church.

Interruptions and irregularities in the schedule of the Men Of Emmaus has been upsetting in the interest of this organization. Some very interesting events were carried out in their schedule, such as the "Men and Boys Supper Cook-Out" with Pastor Irvin Bondo as speaker. Several of our men have participated in the Lutheran Men In America of Racine and its project, the Lincoln Lutheran Home.

Our Senior Choir and Male Chorus have rendered faithful and appreciated service under the direction of Mrs. Vivittee Meyer Nelsen. Special Palm Sunday and Advent-Christmas song festivals were a real inspiration. Faithfulness has been the label deservingly given to our organist who has every Sunday, except two, supplied her assistance at both Services. Our Junior Chorus looks forward to new possiblities with the organizational encouragement offered by a group of Choir Mothers.

While we have been reviewing the events and activities of the past year we are caused to project some suggestions and desires for the new year. Feeling strongly the potential of our small beginning in the use of a "Silent Shepherding Plan" we would like to make it more effective by an All-Congregational participation. We would like to see serious concern given to a 1960-61 Jubilee Evangelism Program. We have suggested that our men, especially those of our Church Council, plan a Week-end Retreat sometime in the summer for the purpose of giving consideration to planning together the objectives and the program of the approaching year. We could add other

suggestions but if we attempt these three we are confident that the Spiritual Life of our beloved Emmaus Congregation will flourish wholesomely under God's grace.

CRADLE ROLL REPORT

The Cradle Roll is an organization within the church which has been keeping in contact with homes of babies to 3 years old. Because of our growing Sunday School and the limited amount of space available for classrooms, the Parish Board of Education has suggested that after October 1, 1960 a child must be 4 years old to enroll in the Sunday School. Therefore hereafter a child will be kept on the Cradle Roll till the fourth birthday, transferring to Sunday School on Promotion Sunday the year the child is four by Dec. 1. There is a possibility of starting a nursery class for 3 year olds during the second service if enough parents are interested.

After a child is baptised, an enrollment card is sent to the child, or after a new family has joined our church, children of Cradte Roll age receive an enrollment card too, and thus become members of our Cradle Roll.

Two file cards are made out, one of which remains in the file and the other goes to the visitor in the appropriate area, who calls on the families approximately four times a year. At present we have 10 areas. Each child is sent a birthday card. An Annual Cradle Roll Party is held each fall.

This year an outline for our "Cradle Roll Messenger" was submitted at our April meeting. June Beck was appointed editor. Beverly Hansen is our typist and each time two different workers assist.

Also this past year seven Christian booklets have been purchased at the Lutheran Book Store and are being takem into the homes by our visitors. Watch for yours, if you have little ones, read it promptly and pass it on to the next one on the list.

By the end of 1959, 48 children have been baptised and 6 others have been added to our Cradle Roll when their parents joined our church. As of December 31, 1959 our records show we have 47 boys and 52 girls, a total of 99 children representing 86 families.

PROPOSED RULES FOR THE USE OF THE CHURCH BUILDING AND FACILITIES

We are happy and thankful that we now have achieved our fine new church building with all the facilities so complete and beautiful and because we wish to encourage the widest possible use of these facilities, the church council has enacted the following rules to help us "live" in our new church home.

- 1. Time and date of all events and meetings must be cleared through the church office and assignment of a definite time made.
- 2. Regularly scheduled meetings of organizations of our church normally hold priority of dates and time assigned to them; however, the church council with the pastor may pre-empt any regularly assigned period when in their judgment circumstances warrant it.
- 3. Our own church groups and organizations may have full use of our facilities to carry on their work, subject to the following restrictions:
 - A. Competent and approved operators must be provided to use slide and movie projectors.
 - B. Use of loud speaker and other electronic devices may be made only under the supervision of the regularly appointed individual.
 - C. Kitchen and serving facilities may be used with the understanding that all equipment is replaced in its proper place and that the stove, urn, refrigerator, etc., are completely cleaned.
 - D. Dishes, glassware, folding tables and the like may not be removed from the church premises.
- 4. No church property may be taken from the church unless the church council makes a special authorization to permit such action.
- 5. Smoking will be permitted in the wash rooms only.
- 6. The making of permanent changes on or in the church property is the sole perogative of the council and trustees. This rule includes the moving of furniture into the building. Temporary decorations may be made, provided scotch tape, nails, or thumb tacks are not used to mar the walls.

7. Funerals.

- A. The use of the Sanctuary for funerals of members is a privilege, freely offered.
- B. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangements being agreed to by President of the Church Council.
- C. If the services of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

Weddings.

A. For use of the Sanctuary for weddings, an honorarium of \$10.00 will be encouraged to cover light, heat and cleaning. This includes the use of Fellowship Hall for the wedding reception.

B. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangement agreed to by the President of

the Church Council.

C. Time and date must be cleared through the church office.

D. If the service of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

E. If serving at a reception in Fellowship Hall is done by an outside caterer, arrangements must be made with our "Women of the Church" for supervision of the kitchen facilities.

8. The Altar.

A. The altar and altar fixtures and appointments are in charge of a suitably trained Altar Guild supervised by the Pastor.

B. Altar vases, communion ware and altar fixtures may not be removed from the church.

C. Cleaning, polishing and care of the altar in general is the

responsibility of the Altar Guild.

D. The giving of memorials to the Altar Flower Fund is to be encouraged. The altar committee will take care of the flowers.

9. Outside Groups.

It is our policy to make our Fellowship Hall available to outside groups and organizations of a Christian nature.

A. A "use" fee - \$10.00 for light, heat and cleaning will be charged.

B. When our ladies serve and are paid for serving a meal, the

"use" fee is cancelled.

C. When kitchen facilities are to be used by outside cooks or caterers, a representative of our kitchen committee must be present to supervise where things are kept and everything left clean and orderly.

Dermission for any outside group to meet in our facilities

must be granted by the Trustees and the Council.
