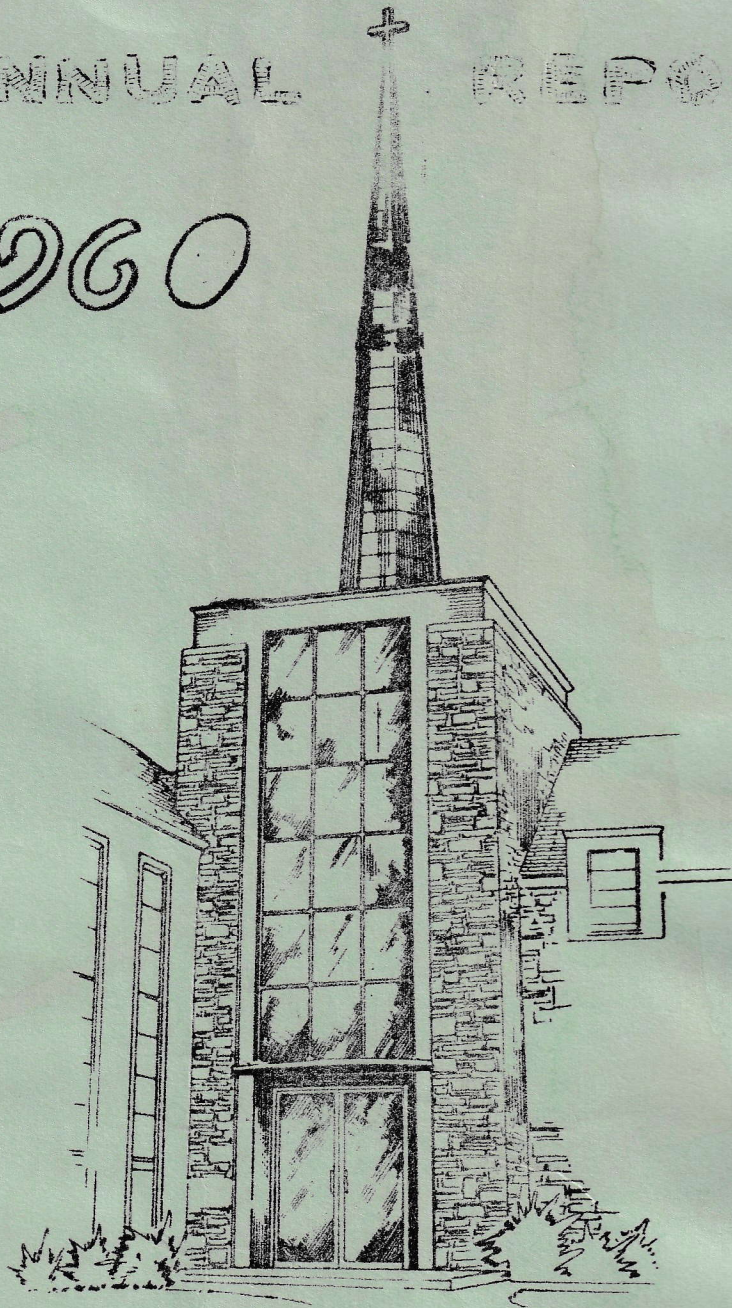

PASTOR'S REPORT

I Corinthians 15:58 - "Therefore, my beloved brethren, be steadfast, immovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, knowing that in the Lord your labor is not in vain."

Dear Members of Emmaus:

"Grace be unto you and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ."

Love, persistence and faith are the marks of Christian endeavor. As a congregation we must adopt these characteristics. Every accent of love is needed in our Lord's Kingdom Work. Realizing that we have all first been loved by God in Christ our Savior, we have a point of beginning the new life and hope we have in heaven. Without our Lord's Divine regard for His Church we could expect her fellowship and service to be of little consequence. It is God who blesses and prospers us in the privileges of His Kingdom's Work. Let us thank Him for another year of striving and pray that He will continue to point the way in the new year.

As the Apostle implies, the urgency of love, persistence and faith was desirable among the members of the Corinthian Congregation, so should it be discovered among us here at Emmaus. Have you taken inventory of your stock of these needs in your work and fellowship in the church?

Statistics for 1960 have not improved as much as we had hoped to see them. We must continue to grow in our consciousness of the challenge our congregation has undertaken. Since we have been privileged to plant our church in a very promising field we must not fail to act responsibly in using every resource to pronounce effectively the invitation of the Gospel of Christ in this area. In this effort we must be persistent.

Many evidences of encouragement have supported your pastor in the past year in coping with this over-whelming task if it were faced single handed. A wonderful step was taken when the council made allowance for a part-time Parish-secretary, in addition to the increased number of volunteers whose work has been effectively coordinated. We appreciate this assistance in making our ministry more purposefully exercised.

Our part-time Parish-secretary has worked three full days, (Monday thru Wednesday) each week, consistently with a very consecrated interest. A very earnest spirit of economy has been exercised, realizing that the Building Debt and Mission Quotas were a sincere objective of our congregation. This is observed in the fact, that beside striving to do a presentable job of publishing weekly bulletins and program materials with office equipment which we hope can be replaced some time soon, the cost of the Parish-secretary was only \$460 out of the \$600 allowed by the budget. Many other willing hearts and hands have helped to perform the work of our congregation. Naming all the individuals who have given unselfishly of their time and talents would be impossible and by them in particular, be regarded unnecessary.

Included in the afore mentioned group we should remember--members of the Church Council and committees, the Sunday School and Vacation Church School teachers, the organist, the choir directors, members of the choirs, the youth counselors and the helpers doing the clerical work, stenographic work and the mailing details and those who have assisted in maintenance and cleaning of the Church property. No one knows better the joy and satisfaction that is found in serving the Lord than those who have so generously contributed their time and ability. They have also caused the operational cost of our congregation to be only about one half of the local expense in other congregations of simular size. The only services compensated during the year were the pastor's, janitor's, senior choir director's, the organist's and the Parish-secretary's.

Guest pastors at Sunday Services this year were: Student Richard Jensen, post-graduate at Maywood Seminary; Pastor Nels C. Carlson, Pasadena, Calif.; Dr. Carl Becker, Administrator of the Lincoln Lutheran Home; Dr. C. R. Evenson and Dr. Wallace Asper of The American Lutheran Church Parish Education Staff. Lenten Services were conducted under the theme: "The Reconciling Love of the Cross"----- IICorinthians 5:16-21. Student Intern Gordon Christensen of Gethsemane Lutheran was guest speaker at one of the Lenten Services. Dr. Dorothy Haas, Executive-director of The American Lutheran Church-women and Pastor Ervin Bondo of Our Saviors Lutheran spoke to the women of Emmaus at special meetings. Rev. Mark Thomsen, missionary to Nigeria, Africa was a guest of the Missionary Society and Pastor LeRoy Andersen of Pewaukee spoke at our Christmas Congregational Fellowship.

A very interesting report of our Cradle Roll is presented elsewhere in this publication. Statistically we are proud to note that we have 148 little tots enrolled. Our workers have continued to do a good job with special recognition being given them by The ALC Parish Education Department inviting our Cradle Roll Chairman, Mrs. Milton Schultz, to an advisory meeting in Minneapolis. Regular publication of a "Cradle Roll Messenger" and an annual fellowship was sponsored by the workers. Several have supplied nursery care at all services which has been very much appreciated.

The continued growth of our Sunday School and the interest in all our Parish Education Department has been very encouraging. A new class for three to four year old children was started in October of 1960. This class meets during the second Worship Service. Our teaching staff benefited much from the experience of being host to the special Sunday School Teacher's Training Institute conducted for the Racine area teachers, as a field-test of materials by the staff of The ALC Parish Education Department from Minneapolis. Presently we have 357 pupils, (this includes adult bible class) and 40 teachers and officers. The Sunday School children's offerings amounted to an average of \$30.75 per Sunday. A gift of \$785 was given to missions through our church treasury by the children.

Vacation Church School was conducted from August 15th thru 26th. The enrollment was 207 with an average attendance of 175 per day. 102 children received perfect attendance awards and an offering of \$105 was given to the Lincoln Lutheran Home Building Fund. We were pleased with the capable and willing volunteer teachers and leadership.

Youth work has been the usual ever trying task of developing potential leadership. This year many of our young people have continued active in the Sunday Youth Bible Class, attended sessions at the International Luther League Convention in Milwaukee and enjoyed our Bible Camp at Shadow Lake, Waupaca, Wisconsin. It is our hope that many more young people of our congregation will take advantage of this fellowship and opportunity for growth in the Christian faith. Our Leaguers have ventured to use the "YES" (Youth, Education and Stewardship) Program. They have sponsored a "Book Nook" and other projects looking forward to being represented at the Luther League Convention in Miami, Florida this coming August.

A Junior Luther League with great potential is still waiting to be organized by someone who wants a real thrill in the work of the Kingdom of Christ.

The re-organization of the Lutheran Churchwomen according to the suggested plans of The American Lutheran Churchwomen has been carried out. The result, we are sure will prove the activating of a number

of more women of our congregation. A period of adjustment will naturally prevail, however, the interesting Bible Studies and suggested programs and projects are encouraging.

A steady development in interest among the Men of Emmaus has been noticed. Responsibility for the ushering service at the church is one of the real helpful projects of this group. We look forward to growth in this improved concern for Christian Life centered programs and fellowship. We challenge more men to venture with us into many of the valuable services the Men of the Church can perform.

Faithfulness has characterized our Senior Choir under the directions of Mrs. Vivette Meyer Nelson. We are grateful for their inspiration and helpfulness at our Worship Services. Thanks is also the least we can give our organist who has been assisted during recent Sundays at the second service. It has been good to see the choir loft well filled every Sunday at the second service with Junior Chorus members. We appreciate the time spent with them by our music committee members who served as directors.

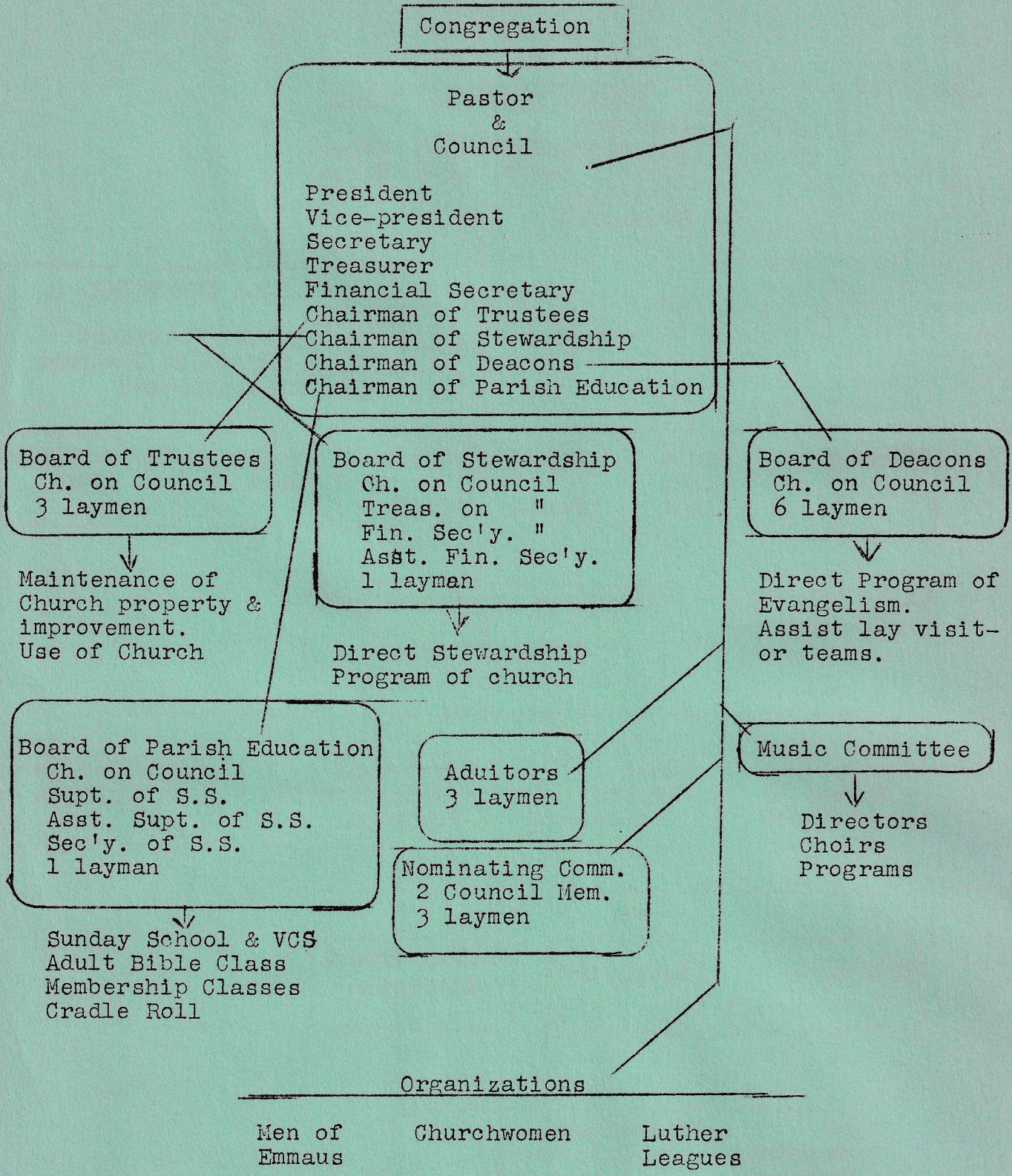
Having reviewed the activities of the past year, we are prompted to project some suggestions and desires for the new year. We are certain that there lies hidden in our congregation much still undeveloped potential which should be brought forth to share in the thrill of doing the Lord's work. We began the New Year by being a "new church", (constituted by Synod mergers into The American Lutheran Church). As a part of our congregation's adjustment to this membership in the "new church" our constitution was revised by a diligent committee and adopted by the congregation. Structure in organization was changed and should cause our church council to be much more functional. The council is made up of representatives whose leadership is concentrated on Evangelism, Stewardship, Education and Property maintenance and improvement. We are confident that all these interests will be cooperatively prospered. They all compliment each other. We suggest that every member of the congregation give serious consideration to appeals that we may improve regularity in church attendance and participation in the fellowship opportunities, especially at the Lord's Table. Growth in these interests will go hand in hand with improved stewardship of services and sacrifices. Let us strive under God's grace to plan and work together to measurably improve the records of our church attendance and our praise of God through regular weekly giving. Our budget calls for \$900 per week. Watch your bulletin for monthly reports. Let's not fall behind, but rather top the goal that all the causes of Christ's Kingdom can be justly supported. Pray that God may by His Holy Spirit show us how to march on in love, persistence and faith.

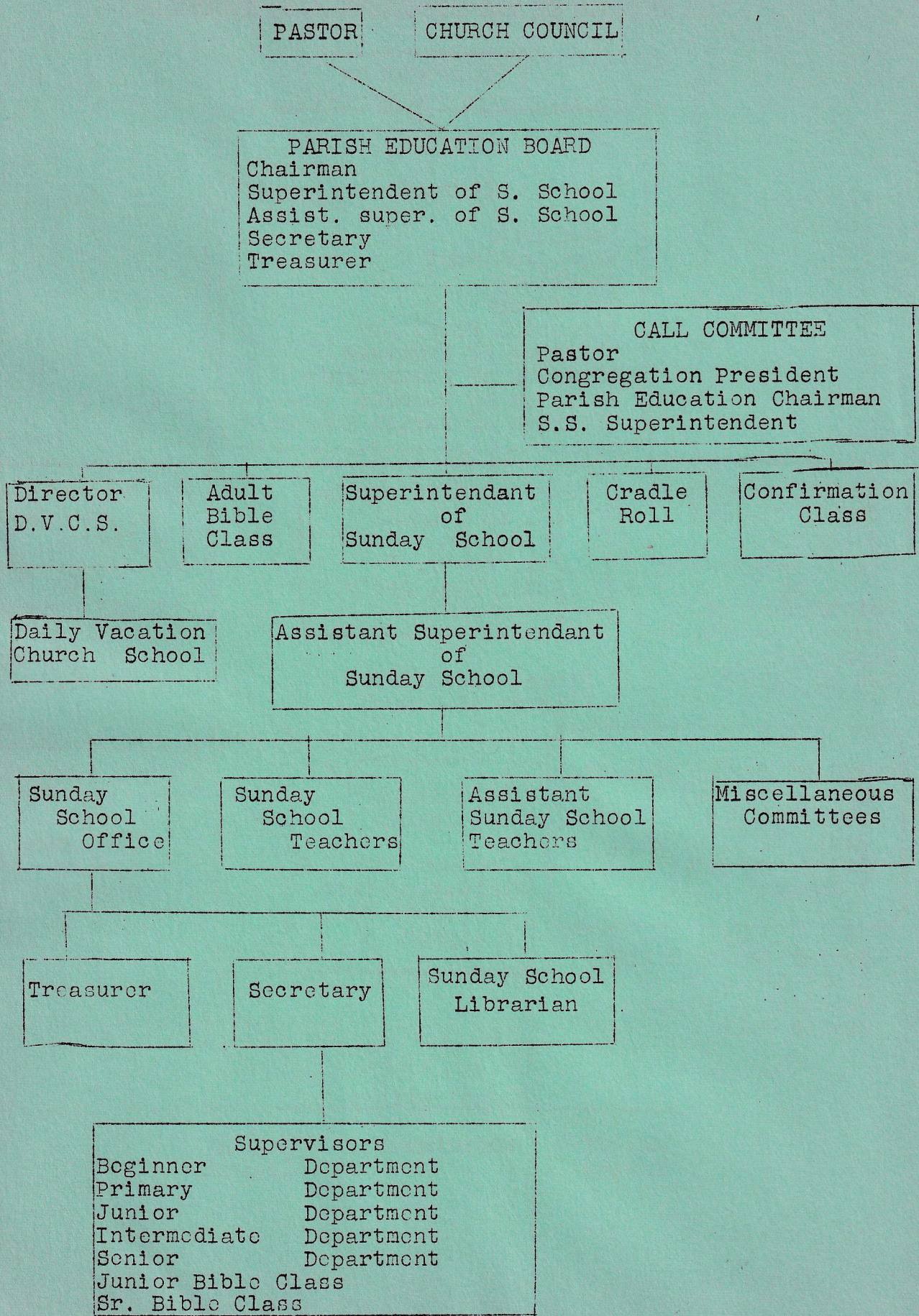

EMMAUS LUTHERAN SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT--1960

320 children are at present enrolled in our regular Sunday School and 6 in the new Nursery Class which meets during the 10:45 Service. This class became a necessity due to the lack of space to accommodate all the children during the regular 9:40 Sunday School session.

We were able to purchase 42 new folding chairs and some bibles because of special gifts received for Sunday School equipment. A record player was purchased at Christmas time in lieu of giving the children sacks of candy and nuts. Several new black boards and two storage cabinets were purchased. Our Sunday School is still in need of many items which would make for more effective teaching.

To date the Sunday School has been self-supporting, including the expenses of the Cradle Roll Program. Last year out of the total receipts of \$2457.20--\$897.10 was spent on lesson material and \$785 was given to missions. We feel our children have done a commendable job in supporting their Sunday School

Several Christmas Remembrances were given to members of our church. A number of leaguers attended the International Convention of Luther Leagues held in Milwaukee last summer and many are looking forward to attending the one to be held in Miami, Florida this year. CRADLE ROLL REPORT

In 1959 the forming of a Cradle Roll Nursery Class for 3 to 4 year old children was discussed and in 1960 the Parish Education Board secured a teacher, Mrs. Ralph Heuser. The class had its first session in October, 1960 during the 10:45 Worship Service. Three year olds were sent an invitation and a few have been attending and like it very much. We are hoping to see more children enrolled in this class soon.

The 3 year old children who had been enrolled in Sunday School before the Parish Board made the new ruling that children were not to be enrolled in the regular Sunday School until they were four, continued in their regular Sunday School class. The setting of this age limit for regular Sunday School was made necessary because of lack of space necessary to accommodate all our children at one time. Children are now kept on the Cradle Roll through their third year and we hope that at that time their parents will enroll them in the regular Sunday School

Our own "Cradle Roll Messenger" has continued to be delivered into the homes of little ones after they are baptized or transferred to Emmaus from another church. We are hoping that the new Parish Board of Education for TALC will come out with a printed magazine. Mrs. Milton Schultz, chairman of our Cradle Roll Department, has been invited to attend a conference in Minneapolis concerning the publishing of such a magazine.

The 1960 statistics show as of December 31, that we have 71 girls and 68 boys, a total of 139 children on our Cradle Roll, representing 112 families. Thirty-five were baptized at Emmaus and 10 were transferred from other churches to our department in 1960.

Past workers we would like to thank for their services are Mrs. Harvey Klein and Mrs. Robert Klug, both moved away from Racine, and Mrs. Nick Filippone, Mrs. Harold Miller and Mrs. Earl Woodward who resigned this year. Mrs. Woodward had served for 18 years as a faithful Cradle Roll Worker.

Many thanks too, to our present workers, including Mrs. Alfred Beck, Mrs. Chris Hansen, Mrs. Lawrence Higgins, Mrs. Hans Jepsen, Mrs. Peter Thomsen, Mrs. Henry Bayer, Mrs. Clifford Christiansen, Mrs. Ole Nielsen, Mrs. Lawrence Estep, Mrs. George I Hansen and Mrs. Esther Zavrski. The last six are new helpers who responded to the call in 1960. Mrs. John Golmant is our newest visitor and will call on familie in her neighborhood.

Approximately one-third of our Cradle Roll families live within 6 or 7 blocks of the church. There are 4 workers in this area. The rest are scattered in and around Racine and Racine and Kenosha Counties.

We hope that these visits are of recognized value to the families and that each home is inspired by the calls.

EMMAUS LUTHERAN CHURCHWOMEN

Preamble: "Mindful that our Lord Jesus Christ, the Divine Head of the Church made use of the service and devotion of women during the days of His earthly ministry, and desiring in our day likewise to follow and serve Him, we now with united effort dedicate ourselves to the furtherance of His kingdom by a Stewardship of Life and Service to the Glory of the Triune God."

With the above message of the preamble to the constitution in mind, on the evening of September 7, 1960, the first meeting of all the women of the church was held to organize the new organization for women to be known as "The Emmaus Lutheran Churchwomen". At this time all various women's organizations of the church terminated their existence and all became members of this one group, as suggested by our new TALC Synod. The purpose is for a more complete reaching of all the women of our congregation and interesting them in the work of the church. The women were divided into ten circles which have set their meeting dates to suit the convenience of their members. About 365 women are eligible for membership and at the present time about one half this number are taking an active part in the activities for the women of the church. It is hoped that as the plan becomes more clear more women will want to take their place on the active list. This is a considerable number more than those taking part before this re-organization took place.

An important part of the new program is centered on Bible Study. This year's theme is "Prayer". The services of the women are divided under two departments--Stewardship and Education. The Stewardship Department directs the use of time, talents and treasures such as:

The Education Department keeps all the women informed as to the work of our missions and what we can do for them as well as providing help with the bible study. They also plan the overall program for the year.

WHY THE "NEW LOOK" ON OUR ENVELOPES

This year your weekly contribution envelope has a new face. In place of space provided for three entries for division of the contribution between, Local, Mission and Building Fund expenses, there is now only one space for indication of total contribution.

Why did we make this change? We have adopted what is called the "Unified Budget" system. Formerly a "Budget" was approved by the congregation at its annual meeting and then we, as individuals, proceeded to direct the flow of contributions by indicating or channeling by means of the envelopes, regardless of the "Budget" already given approval. This at times resulted in inequitable distribution.

In the Church's purpose--to Worship and Glorify God and aid in the spread of His Word, it is the duty of all members to support all phases of the Church, be it local expenses or benevolence. One phase cannot exist without the other. We have a budget. The intent of the "Unified Budget" system is to allow the Church Council (your elected representatives) to direct the expenditures of contributions in the best interest of the Church, and in accord with the Budget. It simplifies it for you as individuals and it greatly aids those who you have elected to serve you.

It is not the intent to discourage special giving. It should be encouraged. Special gifts will be honored and disbursed as directed. The Unified Budget system serves only to aid in the handling of general and mission expenses as budgeted.

PROPOSED RULES FOR THE USE OF THE CHURCH BUILDING AND FACILITIES

We are happy and thankful that we now have achieved our fine new church building with all the facilities so complete and beautiful and because we wish to encourage the widest possible use of these facilities, the church council has enacted the following rules to help us "live" in our new church home.

1. Time and date of all events and meetings must be cleared through the church office and assignment of a definite time made.
2. Regularly scheduled meetings of organizations of our church normally hold priority of dates and time assigned to them; however, the church council with the pastor may pre-empt any regularly assigned period when in their judgment circumstances warrant it.
3. Our own church groups and organizations may have full use of our facilities to carry on their work, subject to the following restrictions:
 - A. Competent and approved operators must be provided to use slide and movie projectors.
 - B. Use of loud speaker and other electronic devices may be made only under the supervision of the regularly appointed individual.
 - C. Kitchen and serving facilities may be used with the understanding that all equipment is replaced in its proper place and that the stove, urn, refrigerator, etc., are completely cleaned.
 - D. Dishes, glassware, folding tables and the like may not be removed from the church premises.
4. No church property may be taken from the church unless the church council makes a special authorization to permit such action.
5. Smoking will be permitted in the wash rooms only.
6. The making of permanent changes on or in the church property is the sole prerogative of the council and trustees. This rule includes the moving of furniture into the building. Temporary decorations may be made, provided scotch tape, nails, or thumb tacks are not used to mar the walls.
7. Funerals.
 - A. The use of the Sanctuary for funerals of members is a privilege, freely offered.
 - B. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangements being agreed to by President of the Church Council.
 - C. If the services of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

Weddings.

- A. For use of the Sanctuary for weddings, an honorarium of \$10.00 will be encouraged to cover light, heat and cleaning. This includes the use of Fellowship Hall for the wedding reception.
- B. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangement agreed to by the President of the Church Council.
- C. Time and date must be cleared through the church office.
- D. If the service of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.
- E. If serving at a reception in Fellowship Hall is done by an outside caterer, arrangements must be made with our "Women of the Church" for supervision of the kitchen facilities.

8. The Altar.

- A. The altar and altar fixtures and appointments are in charge of a suitably trained Altar Guild supervised by the Pastor.
- B. Altar vases, communion ware and altar fixtures may not be removed from the church.
- C. Cleaning, polishing and care of the altar in general is the responsibility of the Altar Guild.
- D. The giving of memorials to the Altar Flower Fund is to be encouraged. The altar committee will take care of the flowers.

9. Outside Groups.

It is our policy to make our Fellowship Hall available to outside groups and organizations of a Christian nature.

- A. A "use" fee - \$10.00 for light, heat and cleaning will be charged.
- B. When our ladies serve and are paid for serving a meal, the "use" fee is cancelled.
- C. When kitchen facilities are to be used by outside cooks or caterers, a representative of our kitchen committee must be present to supervise where things are kept and everything left clean and orderly.
- D. Permission for any outside group to meet in our facilities must be granted by the Trustees and the Council.
