PASTOR'S REPORT

II Corinthians 9:13-15 "Under the test of this service, you will glorify God by your obedience in acknowledging the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your contribution for them and for all others; while they long for you and pray for you, because of the surpassing grace of God in you. Thanks be to God for his inexpressible gift!"

Dear Members of Emmaus:

"Grace and peace be unto you from our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ."

To a congregation into which St. Paul was proud to send visitors who needed their support, these words were directed. He realized that he was placing the members of this congregation at Corinth under a test. He points out that he trusts above all that their regard for the Gospel of Jesus Christ will prove itself sure under God's Grace. Paul has just finished saying, "And God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance, so that you may always have enough of everything and may provide in abundance for every good work."

When the tones of a church bell are sounded, the notes are sent forth, loud and clear. As they travel into the distance the strength of the sound becomes weaker and finally nothing can be heard. Likewise, when a stone is dropped into the placid waters of a large lake or pool, the circle of waves widen until they join the quiet water all around. As we picture a bouncing ball which gradually comes to rest quietly on the sidewalk, the life and interest in our congregation should be just the opposite. As the note from the church bell or the stone dropped into the water, the influence of the church should be likened to their expanding evidence of influence but not to the deminishing evidence of strength.

Under the test and with the acknowledging of the Gospel of Christ we should seek the thrill of bringing many wonderful spiritual accomplishments into a glad reality in life.

Let us as members of Emmaus Lutheran Church look back on the past with Thanksgiving and ahead to the future with prayerful vigor and commitment. Maybe we have not advanced as far and as rapidly as we would like, yet this only increases our challenge for the road ahead.

We are grateful for all the prayers and dedicated help given by leaders and workers in our congregation. Measuring by statistics we note the steady improvement which has been continuing in almost every area of work, yet we feel the compulsion to say that we can by no means conclude that all has been accomplished to complete satisfaction. There is much need to press on even to do those things which we ought to label "urgent". Thinking and talking about such needs being answered in terms of trained help to do the ministry of Christ among us more completely is not enough. Our appeal for more trained help still awaits action. We recall the three points mentioned last year on this subject:

- 1. It is not the pastor who needs the help. It is the ministry of Christ's Church. What kind of ministry does Emmaus Congregation want to offer for Christ?
- 2. A trained worker will not mean less volunteers will be needed, but rather that more volunteers will be provided guidance.
- 3. We can't afford not to have this kind of help. How is it that a congregation whose pastor moves or dies, soon finds ways and means of getting this kind of help?

Another year has passed and the following statistics supply their interest to the story. We are indeed encouraged to note among the figures a substantial increase in communicant members receiving Holy Communion. We are pleased to note the outline of direction in future planning offered in a report by the Visions Committee. (See special report.)





VISION COMMITTEE REPORT

Our current church program with its \$47,000 yearly (\$904 weekly) budget allows for the very minimum church activity development. It seems all budgets are "minimum", but what we mean is—it is a "status quo" budget. This may not be bad in itself, but nothing else stays at the status quo. Membership is up—Sunday School attendance is up—building use is on the increase—higher electric and fuel bills—cost of repair and upkeep is higher. Not a single thing is at status quo except the giving in our church. We just cannot carry on much longer with the thought—"Keep it the same as last year".

Other than paying off on the building indebtedness, we have made little progress in other church programs and its activities. We must not stand still! We must move forward, or we will slide backward!

With this in mind, the Vision presented to the church represents a forward looking program. Not necessarily next year s program--but a program over the next five years or so.

Financially it is within reason. With a reasonable push to increase commitment from the total Congregation in both time and possessions, it can be done without really hurting. Our goal, in order to accomplish the expanded program whould be to increase our commitment from the \$47,000 yearly (\$904 weekly) range to \$60,000 yearly (\$1154 weekly).

With the present membership, this is a targ t within reason. It represents 2.85% of the total estimated <u>family</u> income of our membership.

With a \$60,000 commitment goal attained, we can implement the Vsionary program. It would require no extra "Fund" drives. We could still retire debts at the present rate. We could go immediately into a necessary educational wing Building program on loaned funds and pay this off also.

The results of the questionaire filled out at the "Partnership in the Gospel" program indicated strongly that a more forward looking program is wanted.

The Church program as envisioned by your committee is one that could be accomplished if willed by the Congregation and with the help of God.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT FOR 1963

370 children are enrolled in our regular Sunday School, ranging in age from 5 to 19 years old. This is an increase of 21 pupils over last year. Average Sunday attendance still needs to be stablized. The highest number of pupils present on one Sunday was 310. Again this year we would like to see if we could avoid the "dip" that seems to come each summer in attendance.

Because of the generous response to our special drive for Sunday School room furniture, we have in the past year completed the furnishing of all rooms and replaced all the wooden kindergarten chairs in Fellowship Hall. Six new tables were purchased. We are still in need of four to six more tables to complete the needs in Fellowship Hall.

The Sunday School to date, has been self-supporting, including the expenses of the Cradle Roll Program. Last year's total receipts were \$3,342.06. \$581.64 was given to missions.

A class for three and four year old children meets during the 10:30 Worship Service. This was started to help relieve our crowded space situation at the regular Sunday School hour. Fifteen children are at present enrolled in this class. Mrs. Edward Vincent is the teacher.

Thanks to all who have helped with our Sunday School, including those who have substituted for us, sometimes on very short notice in the teaching department.



PROPOSED RULES FOR THE USE OF THE CHURCH BUILDING AND FACILITIES

We are happy and thankful that we now have achieved our fine new church building with all the facilities so complete and beautiful and because we wish to encourage the widest possible use of these facilities, the church council has enacted the following rules to help us "live" in our new church home.

- 1. Time and date of all events and meetings must be cleared through the church office and assignment of a definite time made.
- 2. Regularly scheduled meetings of organizations of our church normally hold priority of dates and time assigned to them; however, the church council with the pastor may pre-empt any regularly assigned period when in their judgment circumstances warrant it.
- 3. Our own church groups and organizations may have full use of our facilities to carry on their work, subject to the following restrictions:
- A. Competent and approved operators must be provided to use slide and movie projectors.
- B. Use of loud speaker and other electronic devices may be made only under the supervision of the regularly appointed individual.
 - C. Kitchen and serving facilities may be used with the understanding that all equipment is replaced in its proper place and that the stove, urn, refrigerator, etc., are completely cleaned.
 - D. Dishes, glassware, folding tables and the like may not be removed from the church premises.
- 4. No church property may be taken from the church unless the church council makes a special authorization to permit such action.
- 5. Smoking will be permitted in the wash rooms only.
- 6. The making of permanent changes on or in the church property is the sole perogative of the council and trustees. This rule includes the moving of furniture into the building. Temporary decorations may be made, provided scotch tape, nails, or thumb tacks are not used to mar the walls.

7. Funerals.

- A. The use of the Sanctuary for funerals of members is a privilege, freely offered.
- B. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangements being agreed to by President of the Church Council.
- C. If the services of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

Weddings. Whill he will work and thank in those of the second day of

A. For use of the Sanctuary for weddings, an honorarium of \$10.00 will be encouraged to cover light, heat and cleaning. This includes the use of Fellowship Hall for the wedding reception.

3. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangement agreed to by the President of

the Church Council.

C. Time and date must be cleared through the church office.

D. If the service of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

E. If serving at a reception in Fellowship Hall is done by an outside caterer, arrangements must be made with our "Women of the Church" for supervision of the kitchen facilities.

8. The Altar.

- A. The altar and altar fixtures and appointments are in charge of a suitably trained Altar Guild supervised by the Pastor.
- B. Altar vases, communion ware and altar fixtures may not be removed from the church.
- C. Cleaning, polishing and care of the altar in general is the responsibility of the Altar Guild.
- D. The giving of memorials to the Altar Flower Fund is to be encouraged. The altar committee will take care of the flowers.

9. Outside Groups.

It is our policy to make our Fellowship Hall available to outside groups and organizations of a Christian nature.

- A. A "use" fee \$10.00 for light, heat and cleaning will be charged.
- 3. When our ladies serve and are paid for serving a meal, the "use" fee is cancelled.
- C. When kitchen facilities are to be used by outside cooks or caterers, a representative of our kitchen committee must be present to supervise where things are kept and everything left clean and orderly.
 - D. Permission for any outside group to meet in our facilities must be granted by the Trustees and the Council.

More landscaping to make our property more attractive.


