Saints are believers in Jesus Christ, and we believe and teach that all they have and can accomplish is done by the grace of God, through the power of the Holy Spirit. Thus, while we bask under His benediction in thanksgiving for the past, let us in prayer under God's promise press forward to approach the challenges of the future.

As we reflect on the past year we cannot help but rejoice. At the beginning of 1963 some questioned our potential to meet the objective of budget, benevolence, etc. Marvelous blessings have been experienced. Generous gifts and memorials have helped to provide many improvements beyound those contemplated. We all rejoice to see the interior and exterior of our attractive church building enriched in its appeal of beauty. The wonderful lawn nurtured by an automatic sprinkling system has brought forth many favorable comments. The refinishing of most of the wood trim, the painting and washing of the walls wherever needed throughout the building, together with the new stove and ceiling in the kitchen has been a very helpful project in keeping our church looking like new. More recently the outdoor flood lighting system has brought out a new dimension of enchantment which our church's exterior possesses.

We are also mindful of the man other projects accomplished which inspire our gratitude to God and all members and friends who have shown their love for Emmaus Church. We rejoice in all the prayers and dedicated loyalty expressed through gifts and regular contributions making possible our exceeding our goal for benevolence through the American Lutheran Church.

We are indeed grateful for the faithful and effective cooperation and service rendered in the soul winning concern of the church. Every ministry offered is important in the Kingdom of Christ. We have been assisted greatly by the host of volunteer workers, such as: leaders in church council, auxiliaries, committees, organist, music directors, Sunday School teachers, and workers in every phase of our church's mission. Not least sincerely are we grateful for the ever dependable help afforded by Mrs. Harold Wiegand, our part-time Church office secretary, our part-time custodians, Mr. & Mrs. Norbert Trottier, and Mr. Bill Hanson, seminarian, who assisted this summer as student intern.

Among the activities deserving our attention is the work accomplished for our children in both the Children's and Confirmation Classes Choirs, as well as the Junior Lutheran program. A good beginning has been made in serving this long felt need and we look forward to the continuing of this worthwhile effort. Our Men of Emmaus continues to need faithful support and interest in participation. An informal Adult Fellowship group has periodically sponsored activities of increasing interest. Our Luther League has developed a steady pace of regular meetings each week, with few exceptions. Although our leauge has been among the best represented in attending rallies with other Luther Leagues, we feel that many of our youth from who we should expect leadership shy away from participation. We hope that the future may witness a more inclusinve participation. The work of the women of the church is well out-lined. The improvement of their function could be realized by more women of the church actively participating. Let us all remember that organizational endeavors in our congregation are intended to be a part of the promotion of deeper interest in the kingdom of God.



VISION COMMITTEE REPORT

Our current church program with its \$52,000.00 yearly (\$1000 weekly) budget allows for the very minimum church activity development. It seems all budgets are "minimum", but what we mean is—it is a "status quo" budget. This may not be bad in itself, but nothing else stays at the status quo. Membership is up—Sunday School attendance is upbuilding use is on the increase—higher electric and fuel bills—cost of repair and upkeep is higher. Not a single thing is at status quo execept the giving in our church. We just cannot carry on much longer with the thought—"Keep it the same as last year".

Other than paying off on the building indebtedness, we have made little progress in other church programs and its activities. We must not stand still! We must more forward, or we will slide backward!

With this in mind, the Vision presented to the church represents a forward looking program. Not necessarily next year's program—but a program over the next five years or so.

Financially it is within reason. With a reasonable push to increase commitments from the total congregation in both time and possessions, it can be done without really hurting. Our goal, in order to accomplish the expanded program should be to increase our commitment from the \$52,000 yearly (\$1000 weekly) range to \$60,000 yearly (1154 weekly).

With the present membership, this is a target within reason. It represents 2.85% of the total estimated <u>family</u> income of our membership.

With a \$60,000 commitment goal attained, we can implement the Visionary program. It would require no extra "Fund" drives. We could still retire debts at the present rate. We could go immediately into a necessary educational wing building program on loaned funds and pay this off also.

The Church program as envisioned by your committee is nne that could be accomplished if willed by the Congregation and with the help of God.

***Let us note that during the first year of the proposed Vision Program we have advanced one-third of the way in the required difference toward this objective.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

Our Sunday School is like a wheel with many spokes. As in all other activities in the congregation the hub of the wheel is the pastor. The many spokes are the teachers, office staff and members of the Board of Parish Education, the children and their parents. The superintendent might be considered as the nut that keeps the wheel together. In order that the wheel does not become flat on one side each spoke must be

strong and remain strong at all times.

Our staff consists of 35 teachers and office staff, plus 6 substitute teachers. These men and women serve faithfully Sunday after Sunday. Some of our teachers have been serving for more than 25 years. Others who have served for just a short time have been very faithful. Being a Sunday School teacher is more than spending an hour with the children. It means much time spent in preparation of the lesson, expressing their concern for the children in prayer, and in making home visitations when necessary. Our congregation should recognize the work of our teachers by a word of encouragement when the opportunity presents itself.

There are 400 children enrolled. It is a joy to see them come each Sunday with their smiling faces and enthusiasm. Most of the children are regular in their attendance. However, there are too many who are not regular. Perhaps, we should reflect to see if the children are following in the footsteps of the adults who are not regular in their church attendance. The discipline of our children is very fine. However, there are bound to be some exceptions. We would encourage the parents to remind their children to help the teacher by being on their best behavior. We are looking forward to the day when we will have adequate space for our classes.

Financially the Sunday School is self-supporting. In fact more than that. The adult congregation received \$500.00 from the Sunday

School to help pay the Mission quota of our church.

During the past year a new group, called "The Junior Lutherans" has been started. While this group is not a part of the S.S., it is for the children in the 4th, 5th and 6th grades. So far the average attendance has been about 23. The children of this age group should be encouraged to attend these activities, consisting of studying missionary heroes, doing interesting handwork, and participating in social activities. This group is being led by a few of our ladies.

Jesus said, "Let the children come to me and do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of heaven." We in the S.S. are happy for the opportunity to plant the Word in the hearts of boys and girls.

We pray that the Holy Spirit will give the increase.

In order to contine serving effectively, the S.S. urgently needs additional space. We need more adults who are willing to serve as teachers: particularly do we need men teachers. We are in need of a song leader for the Opening Service. We look to the adult members of our congregation to fill these needs.

PROPOSED RULES FOR THE USE OF THE CHURCH BUILDING AND FACILITIES

We are happy and thankful that we now have achieved our fine new church building with all the facilities so complete and beautiful and because we wish to encourage the widest possible use of these facilities, the church council has enacted the following rules to help us "live" in our new church home.

- 1. Time and date of all events and meetings must be cleared through the church office and assignment of a definite time made.
- 2. Regularly scheduled meetings of organizations of our church normally hold priority of dates and time assigned to them; however, the church council with the pastor may pre-empt any regularly assigned period when in their judgment circumstances warrant it.
- 3. Our own church groups and organizations may have full use of our facilities to carry on their work, subject to the following restrictions:
 - A. Competent and approved operators must be provided to use slide and movie projectors.
 - B. Use of loud speaker and other electronic devices may be made only under the supervision of the regularly appointed individual.
 - C. Kitchen and serving facilities may be used with the understanding that all equipment is replaced in its proper place and that the stove, urn, refrigerator, etc., are completely cleaned.
 - D. Dishes, glassware, folding tables and the like may not be removed from the church premises.
- 4. No church property may be taken from the church unless the church council makes a special authorization to permit such action.
- 5. Smoking will be permitted in the wash rooms only.
- 6. The making of permanent changes on or in the church property is the sole perogative of the council and trustees. This rule includes the moving of furniture into the building. Temporary decorations may be made, provided scotch tape, nails, or thumb tacks are not used to mar the walls.

7. Funerals.

- A. The use of the Sanctuary for funerals of members is a privilege, freely offered.
- B. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangements being agreed to by President of the Church Council.
- C. If the services of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

og Weddings.

A. For use of the Sanctuary for weddings, an honorarium of \$10.00 will be encouraged to cover light, heat and cleaning. This includes the use of Fellowship Hall for the wedding reception.

3. In the absence of the Pastor, another Lutheran Clergyman shall officiate; arrangement agreed to by the President of

the Church Council.

C. Time and date must be cleared through the church office.

D. If the service of an organist is desired, it is customary to provide an honorarium. Organists other than the regular church organists must be approved by the Pastor.

E. If serving at a reception in Fellowship Hall is done by an outside caterer, arrangements must be made with our "Women of the Church" for supervision of the kitchen facilities.

8. The Altar.

A. The altar and altar fixtures and appointments are in charge of a suitably trained Altar Guild supervised by the Pastor.

B. Altar vases, communion ware and altar fixtures may not be removed from the church.

C. Cleaning, polishing and care of the altar in general is the

responsibility of the Altar Guild.

D. The giving of memorials to the Altar Flower Fund is to be encouraged. The altar committee will take care of the flowers.

9. Outside Groups.

It is our policy to make our Fellowship Hall available to outside groups and organizations of a Christian nature.

A. A "use" fee - \$10.00 for light, heat and cleaning will be charged.

B. When our ladies serve and are paid for serving a meal, the

"use" fee is cancelled.

C. When kitchen facilities are to be used by outside cooks or caterers, a representative of our kitchen committee must be present to supervise where things are kept and everything left clean and orderly.

D. Permission for any outside group to meet in our facilities

must be granted by the Trustees and the Council.

Calling an Assistant Pastor and expanding the services of our church to our community.


