# Video Streaming at Emaus

When the pandemic started, Emaus began videoing nearly all Sunday morning services. You can find those videos at <a href="EmausELCA1.org">EmausELCA1.org</a>. The Greater Milwaukee Synod of the ELCA and the Siebert Lutheran Foundation have recognized this technology as the "wave of the future".

There is a need for this technology. Some members of our congregation are unable to attend church in person. There are others who may not be able to travel to a wedding or a funeral but would want to see the event in real time. In addition, this capability will provide easy access for those seeking to hear the Word on a regular basis, no matter where they are.

Emaus has been promised \$2,500 from the synod to support the purchase and installation of the cameras and other equipment. The church council voted to go

ahead with the video streaming project at its meeting on June 15. The vendor that has been selected is Metro Sound and Video. Installation is scheduled to take place on November  $3^{rd}$  and  $4^{th}$ . This equipment will be the easiest to use and will offer expandability in the future.

The cost of about \$8,000 is obviously outside our current budget. Accounting for the \$2,500 from the synod, we will need to find the additional \$5,500. If you are interested in donating to this project, please indicate that on your offering envelope or tag your online donation in the "Other" category with "Video Streaming."
