Celebration of Holy Week

The main event in the month of April is the celebration of Holy Week. For the

Christian faith, the resurrection of Christ is the most important event because it shows us three things. First, that human life does not end with physical death, but it continues even beyond death; second, that Christ overcame death and in doing so he has brought us life; third, because

Christ died, we too have died with him, and because Christ rose, we too will rise with him to eternal life.

There is plenty of biblical and historical evidence for the resurrection of Christ.

1) The empty tomb: everyone who went to the tomb found the tomb empty. This is a recognized place (John 15:47). The very theory that the disciples stole the body (Matthew 28:11-15) is proof of the empty tomb. Also, there was a guard watching over the tomb (Matthew 27:62-66).

2) The different and many appearances of the resurrected Jesus Christ that are described in the four gospels (eleven in all). According to Luke the period of appearances lasted forty days (Acts 1:13) and ended with his ascension.

3) The existence of the church for more than two thousand years is the best historical proof of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, because no lie (if it were) holds up for that long.

The resurrection is a historical fact, and it constitutes the basis of the Christian faith. It is a liberating work of God because it takes Jesus out of the prison of death. Any denial of this event is nothing more than an attempt to distort the heart of faith and the power of God. So let us joyfully proclaim that Christ has died, Christ has risen, and that Christ will come again.

On the other hand, on April 25 the church also celebrates the Day of Saint Mark the Evangelist. According to the Bible, Mark was not part of Jesus' group, but rather an evangelist who worked alongside Peter, Paul, and Barnabas (Acts 13:5).

"John" was his Hebrew name and "Mark" his Roman surname (Ac 12:12). He is the author of the Gospel According to Saint Mark.

He was the son of a rich widow named Mary, whose house was a meeting place for the early Christians in Jerusalem (Acts 12: 12-17). Mark has been believed to be the young man in the white sheet who ran away naked, mentioned in Mark 14:50-52. According to tradition he was the founder and first bishop of the Church of Alexandria. Years later the Venetians seized his remains and took him to Venice where today he is the patron saint.

They tried their hand at Vincent van Gogh's sunflowers. The sunflower has been highlighted because that is the country flower of Ukraine. Each painted their own interpretation of a sunflower, and created a sunflower with Legos.

A Pastoral Letter Affirming our LGBTQIA+ Siblings

"For it was you who formed my inward parts; you knit me together in my mother's womb. I praise you, for I am fearfully and wonderfully made. Wonderful are your works; that I know very well." - Psalm 139:13-14

Friends in Christ:

To be honest, there are a whole host of issues that have filled recent headlines that weigh heavy on my heart and mind: war in Ukraine, economic challenges, political division, and all of the uncertainties related to the pandemic. One issue, however, that has garnished significant attention, which I believe the gospel of Jesus Christ directly addresses, is the recent assault on the LGBTQIA+ community, particularly our transgender siblings. Recent legislative efforts and religious pronouncements have sought to portray these siblings and those who love and support them as criminal and sinful. This is contrary to what our church teaches and what I believe deep in my heart and soul. This is also contributing to a climate in which the <u>rates of suicide and</u> <u>depression among transgender youth</u> is truly alarming. This is not about being politically correct; it's about saving lives.

I'll admit, my own understanding of what it means to be transgender has grown significantly in recent years, and there is still much that I don't know and may never

understand. But the gospel that saves and guides us is crystal clear: we are to love and serve and protect our neighbors. All of them.

Human sexuality, romantic love, and gender identity are amazing and complex gifts from God that defy simplistic understandings and rigid definitions. We are all "fearfully and wonderfully made," and we are all on a journey of discovering what it means to live in loving and life-giving relationships. I call upon all our congregations and leaders to take the time to listen to and learn from those with differing gender identities and expressions, and to engage in the hard and holy work of ensuring that our communities truly embody grace, mercy, and radical welcome for all. Let's work together so that all people everywhere hear this life-giving and life-changing message:

God meets you where you are. God loves you as you are. God will walk with you as you discover who you are. In grace and hope,
