Messages From Pastor Marcy

Latino Worship Leader and Time Changes

Several months ago, the Latino Roundtable, a group of Spanish-speaking worship leaders in the Greater Milwaukee Synod, approached me with a leadership proposal for our Spanish-speaking worship service. They expressed a desire to help us find a sustainable way to keep our Latino ministry going. After a number of meetings and discussions between the Emaus staff, the church council, the Spanish-speaking community here, and the bishop, Pastor Miguel Perez began leading the Spanish worship service here at Emaus on March 23.

. Pastor Miguel will be our regular provider of Spanish worship leadership, leadership of special services like quinceaneras, and the potential for other involvement in the life of Emaus such as Bible Studies. The initial contract will last for six months and then it will be revisited and tweaked as necessary. Just for the record, the Synod has agreed to provide funds to assist in making this arrangement affordable for Emaus.

Pastor Miguel was ordained in the Missouri Synod tradition and is involved in a process that will result in his placement on the ELCA clergy roster. Pastor German Novelli Angrisano of Santa Fe-Milwaukee will be his mentor in this process and he will be conducting in-person supervision of Pastor Miguel two Sundays each month.

As a result of Pastor German's noon worship service at Santa Fe, it is necessary for our worship times at Emaus to change.

Know that I do not take this change lightly. It requires an adaptation for all of us, but I firmly believe that the proposal being presented to us is a very positive step forward. I truly think that my desire to begin this relationship with very clear expectations of Pastor Miguel, as well as the presence of a Spanish-speaking mentor, make this a very different situation than our previous attempts at engaging Spanish-speaking leaders.

That said, beginning May 4, 2025 the English worship service will begin at 8:30am on Sunday. The Spanish service will begin at 10:00am.

I ask for your prayers for Pastor Miguel, Pastor German, and for Emaus as we step out in faith and I ask you to please be patient with this transition. Let me know if you have any questions or concerns!

Both of those events were organized by volunteers and funded by \$250 grants by Thrivent to its members.

The grant application takes about five minutes and we'll provide you the information you need to complete it!



Oh, the oohs and aahs of science! What causes ice to cling to string so that you can pick it up? Just add a bit of salt!










Dr. Seuss continues to bring fun and laughter to our kids and mentors. His birthday is celebrated annually on March 2nd and
